




# MWSBE SPEND BY SOURCE

The MWSBE spend of nearly \$315 million was from three sources:

- PA prime and sub-contracts: \$195 million
- WTC construction projects: \$66 million
- Aviation tenants: \$54 million

# REGIONAL ECONOMIC IMPACT OF MWSBE SPEND

The regional economic impact of the \$315 million in MWSBE spend:

- 2,453 job-years
- \$154 million in wages
- \$531 million in economic activity

# ADDITIONAL MWSBE AND DBE ACTIVITY FROM WTC TENANTS AND NEW PARTNERS

- Additional MWSBE and DBE activity from WTC tenants and partners from the Goethals Bridge Modernization Program and the George Washington Bridge Bus Station yielded a total of \$72.5 million in awards
- The \$72.5 million in MWSBE and DBE activity when added to our MWSBE spend of \$315 million totaled \$387.5 million

# CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

- In 2015: 15 MWSBEs participated in the core Mentor-Protégé Program
- 67 MWSBEs have participated in the core program since its inception in 2002
- Four protégés were awarded four Port Authority prime contracts totaling approximately \$10.4 million
- Three protégés were awarded five subcontracts totaling \$1.9 million, which included work on some of the Port Authority's major capital projects

# CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

## Capacity Building Programs

Through our contract with the Regional Alliance for Small Contractors, 16 courses were offered with nearly 420 MWSBE attendees.

## Pre-Apprenticeship Training Programs

- **New York** –Edward J. Malloy Initiative for Construction Skills -135 participants
- **New Jersey** – 131 participants in the Newark Construction Careers Program and the Urban League of Hudson County, Inc., Civil Construction Worker Training and Entrepreneurial Development Center

## Outreach Highlights

- Co-sponsored and/or participated in MWSBE networking events in New York and New Jersey, which attracted some 8,000 attendees
- Collaborated with BNP Media/Engineering News Record again to present the “Paving the Way for New Opportunities Conference” focusing on an MWSBE audience of over 500 attendees

# INTEGRITY MONITORING

Maintaining the integrity of our MWSBE and DBE programs has always been of utmost importance. Consistent with this objective:

- Office of Inspector General (OIG) has been instrumental in the prosecution of firms that have tried to circumvent the integrity of our programs
- Review of MWSBE and DBE applications has continued to be diligent despite a large increase in certification requests due to major capital investments in the region
