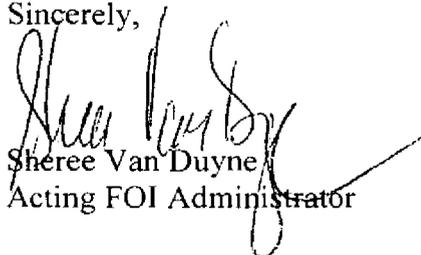

Retail & Parking – Preconstruction Services

- Tishman/ Turner Joint Venture III selected to provide pre-construction services (estimating, scheduling, and scope packages) in September 2010
- Authorized extension per original contract terms in December 2010
- Ratification of additional services to advise on the transfer of certain Retail & Parking fit-out work to SPI

Scope	Amount (\$'s)
Original Scope (September 2010)	\$900,000
3-month Extension (December 2010)	\$600,000
Proposed Ratification (February 2011)	\$400,000
TOTAL	\$1,900,000

Retail & Parking – Construction Management Services

- Recommend approval of Tishman/Turner Joint Venture III to perform full Construction Management services, including:
 - Retail Pre-Tenant Fit-Out
 - Parking Pre-Tenant Fit-Out
 - Coordination of transferred Retail and Parking scope
- Total cost: \$27.7 million

** .53% of Construction Costs*

Scope of Work

- Above Grade Scope (Towers 3 & 4 Podiums, Cortlandt Way)
 - Retail net-lessee dedicated systems from point of service to inside lease spaces
 - Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing, Fire Protection
 - Building Automatic Temperature Controls (BATC)
 - Vertical Transportation
 - Fire Alarm
 - Architectural Finishes (inclusive of storefronts, walls, ceilings, and floors)

- Below Grade Scope (East and West Bathtubs)
 - Retail net-lessee and Parking dedicated systems from point of service to inside lease spaces
 - Mechanical, Electrical and Plumbing, Fire Protection
 - BATC
 - Vertical Transportation
 - Fire Alarm
 - Di minimis Architecture Finishes (i.e. demising walls between lease spaces, public bathrooms, and back-of-house support spaces)

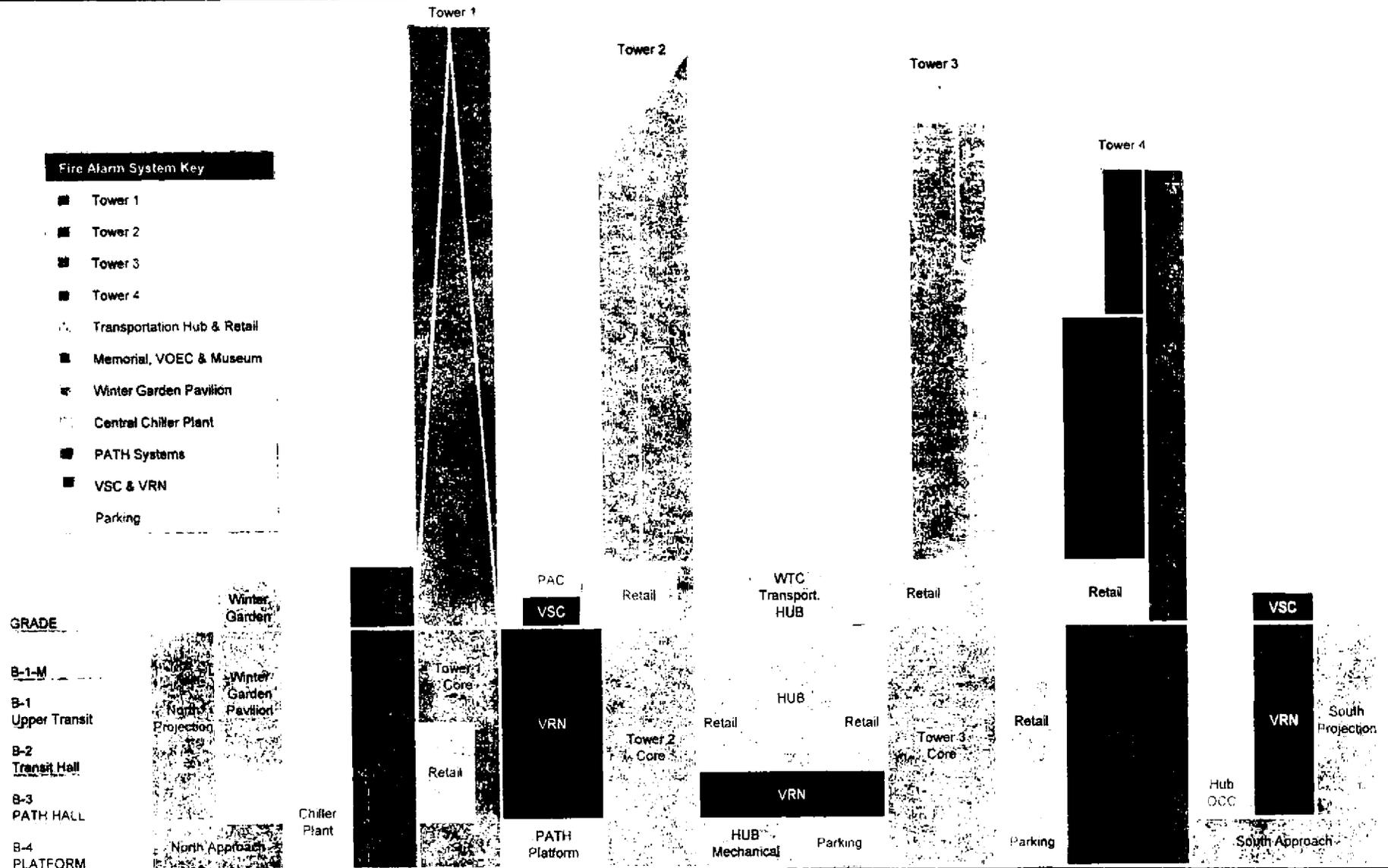
Scope of Work

- Retail Pre-Tenant Fit-Out
 - 523,000 GSF in East and West Bathtubs
 - \$129.5 M in trade costs
- Parking Pre-Tenant Fit-Out
 - 118,000 GSF in East Bathtub
 - \$12.7 M in trade costs
- Retail and Parking Transfer Coordination
 - Scope transfer to 2 WTC, 3 WTC and 4 WTC
 - \$78.3 M in trade costs

WTC Systems Integration – Overview

- Plan to integrate and coordinate site-wide systems is required to:
 - Address building compatibility and operability issues
 - Save long-term operating and maintenance costs
 - Optimize site-wide security connectivity
 - Develop common system interfaces
 - Support centralized operations
 - Coordinate various systems across program boundaries
- WTC systems integration is essential to operability, marketability, and the commercial success of the WTC Site

WTC Systems Integration – Operational Review

- Operational Review of Systems including:
 - Fire and Life Safety Systems
 - Smoke Evacuation & Fire Command Stations
 - Building Management Systems
 - Utilities Program & Sub-metering
 - High-Security Keying System
 - Level Identification Coordination
 - Vertical Transportation Monitoring Systems
- Integration of these systems will provide cost effective operational and building connectivity upon opening

WTC Systems Integration – Planning Authorization

- \$8.1 million planning authorization includes:
 - \$4.4 million for operational analysis consulting services
 - \$2.5 million for WTC stakeholder A&E design services
 - » Fire Alarm & Life Safety Systems
 - » Smoke Evacuation Systems
 - » Utilities Sub-meter Program
 - \$1.2 million for general and administrative and financial expense

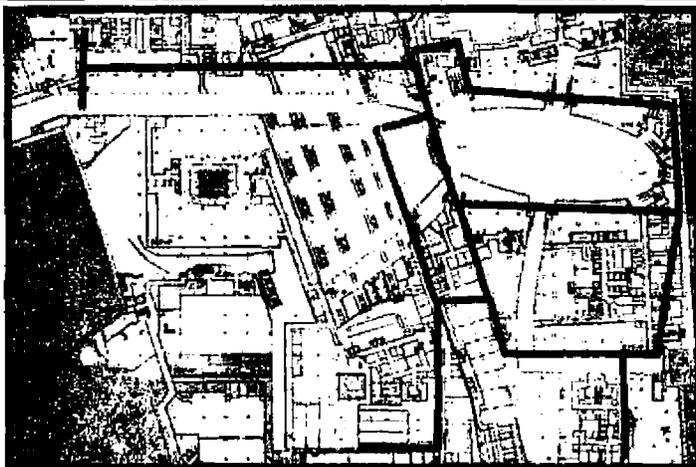

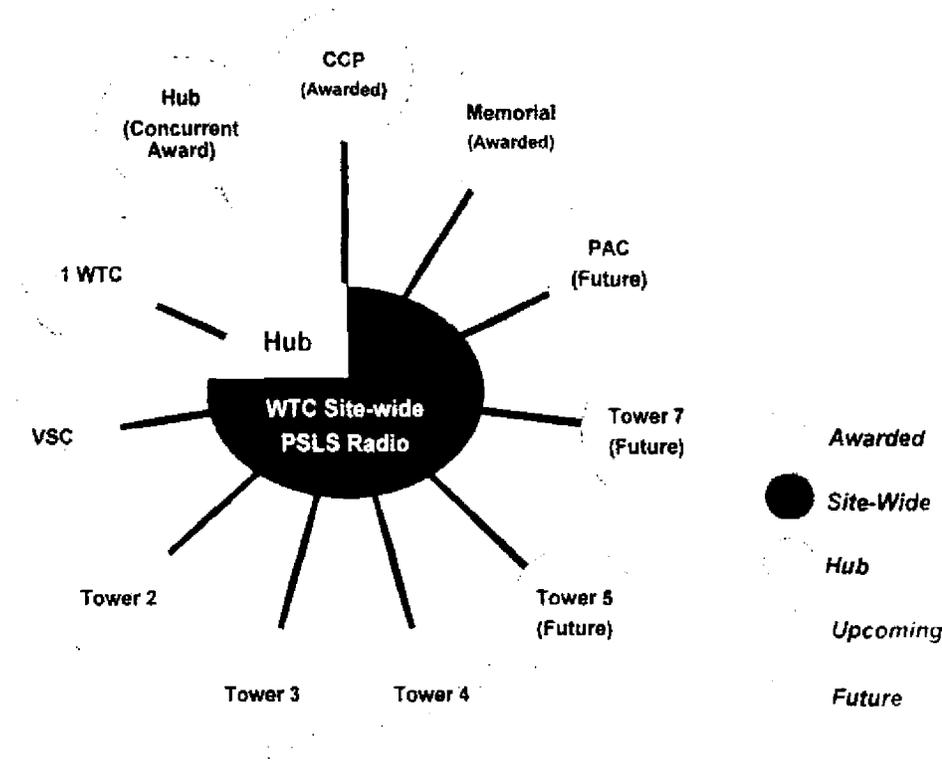

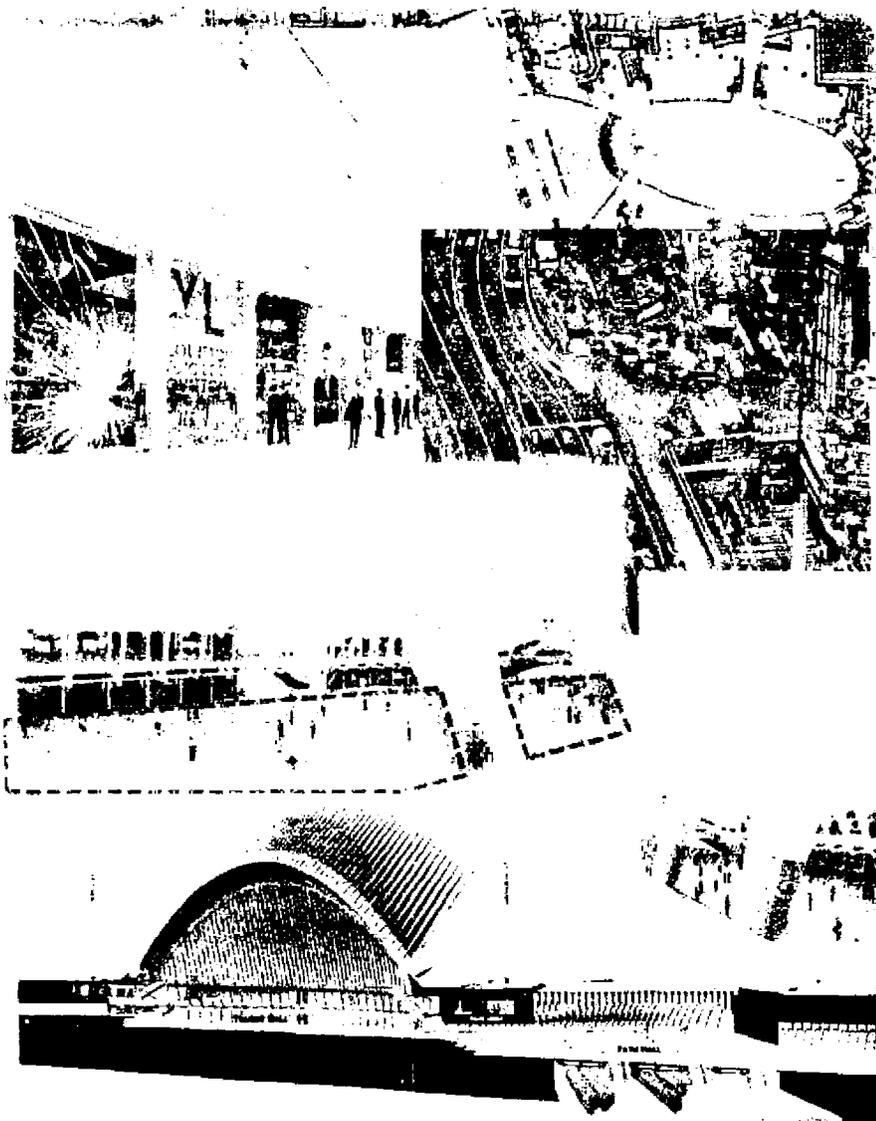

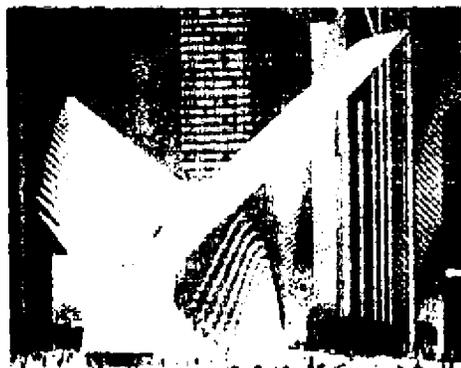

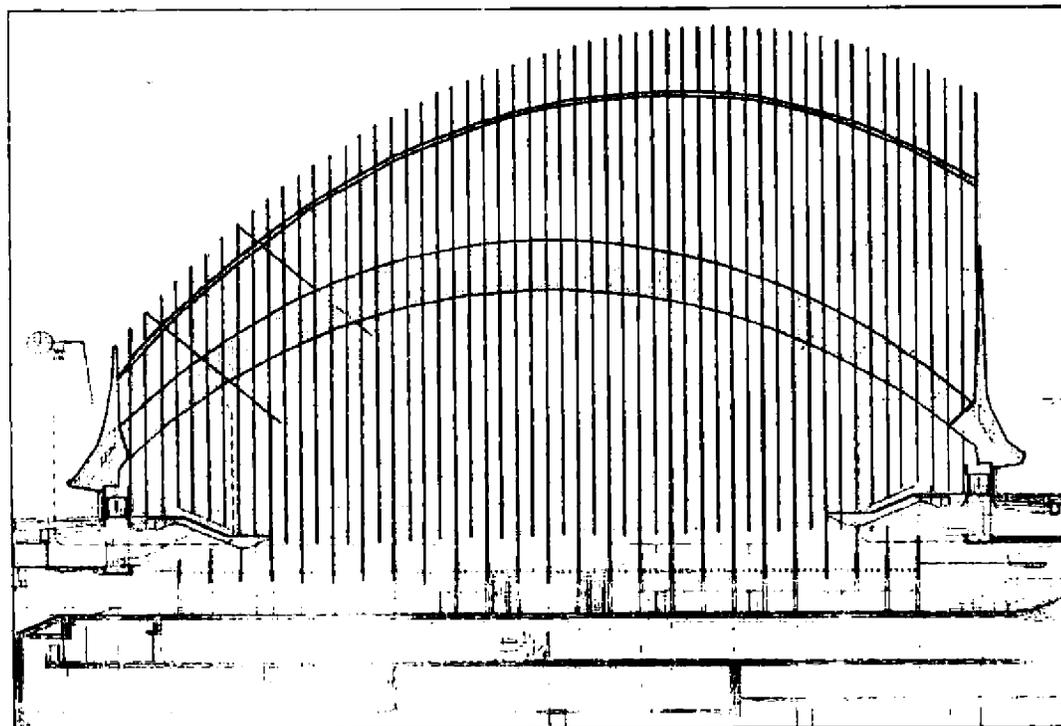

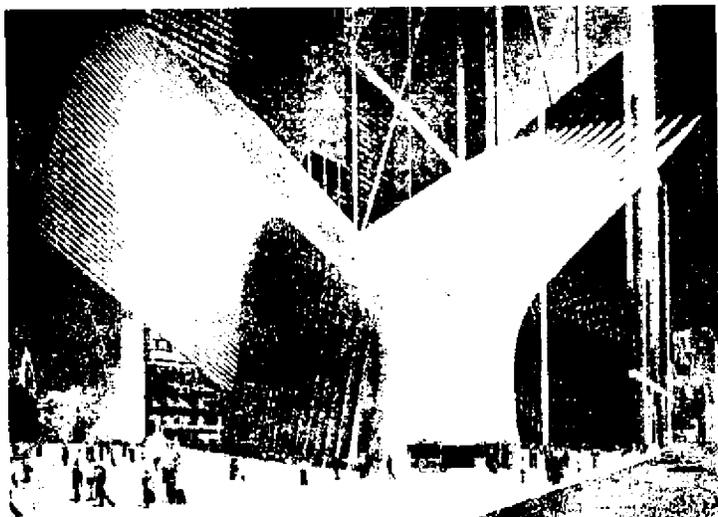
