

Dear Messrs. Ward and Emil,

As you may be aware, New York University recently announced a long-term strategy for physical growth over the next two to three decades. That strategic framework - *NYU 2031: NYU in NYC* - takes account of the fact that certain academic needs must be met near our core, and so we will be moving forward with plans to seek approval for building on our own property in Greenwich Village in the coming months. However, another key element of NYU's strategy is the recognition that our neighborhood cannot accommodate all the needed growth, and that fully half of it must be developed in locations more remote from our core area. For that reason, we would like to discuss lower Manhattan as part of our exploration of remote sites. *NYU 2031* has already identified three possible remote sites for NYU facilities: in our health corridor (along First Avenue near our existing Medical and Dental facilities); Downtown Brooklyn (building on our new affiliation with Polytechnic); and Governors Island.


Lower Manhattan, and particularly "Tower 5", have been identified by both Manhattan Community Board #1 and a Community Task Force led by the Borough President as an area that might offer mutually beneficial opportunities for growth. I am sure you are aware that we already have a presence in lower Manhattan with our School of Continuing and Professional Studies leasing several floors in the Woolworth Building; and we have had other past uses in downtown as well.

We would welcome the chance to meet with you and understand what opportunities might exist to enhance the remote site component of our growth strategy, to understand the long-term vision for Lower Manhattan and to assess whether there is some role that the University can play to help revitalize and diversify the area. We would also like to make a presentation to you to help you understand our near and longer-term needs in terms of types of facilities, types of uses and our capacity for larger (one-time) vs. smaller (incremental) projects.

I will be in touch with your offices in the coming days to request a meeting.
