Re: Records Request - Notices of Claims received by the Port Authority and its subsidiaries, including PATH, between January 1, 2011 to January 1, 2012

Dear FOI Administrator Duffy:

The Port Authority's amended and restated By-Laws, as most recently amended in May 2008, provide that the Port Authority "shall follow a Freedom of Information Policy that is consistent with the freedom of information law of the States of New York and New Jersey" and that "all records of the Port Authority (and its wholly owned corporations), including records stored electronically (such as on computer hard drives) shall be made available for public inspection and copying." The policy further provides: "[w]here practical, and upon request, the Port Authority may provide responses in electronic format." The policy provides for a \$5.00 fee for records provided in electronic format (CD or DVD).

Accordingly, I request the Port Authority to produce under New Jersey's Open Public Records Act (OPRA) as incorporated into the Port Authority's Freedom of Information policy all Notices of Claims received by the Port Authority and its subsidiaries, including PATH, between January 1, 2011 to January 1, 2012. I assume the records are stored in electronic format and are readily accessible in electronic format. If I am wrong please email me promptly. Please provide these records in electronic format (preferably via email or on CD or DVD) within seven days, N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6. If you choose to provide the information on CD or DVD, please let me know and I will arrange to have a check delivered and the CD or DVD picked up.

OPRA states that a custodian of the record must, within seven business days after receiving a request, either "grant access to a government record or deny a request for access to a government record as soon as possible." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-5. OPRA further provides "[f]ailure by a governmental entity to provide any response to a request under OPRA constitutes a denial." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-4(d). OPRA further provides that "if a governmental entity denies a request, the requesting party may file a complaint in the

superior court for a summary action against the governmental entity to compel production of the government records." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6 Finally, OPRA provides that a party who files an action against a governmental entity to compel the production of documents under OPRA after a denial and "prevails in any proceeding shall be entitled to a reasonable attorney's fee." N.J.S.A. 47:1A-6. Please be guided accordingly.

The law firm chosen by the PARA Board's special committee has now largely concluded its review of the E-ZPass Notice of Claim issue, and will continue the second part of the assignment: assessing the security of our overall retiree benefits.

NOTICE OF CLAIM

PARA's attorneys prepared an updated Notice of Claim form, having the benefit of the version prepared by Tom Westfield. We have included the form in this mailing for your convenience. It is also posted on PARA's Web site.

FAQs

- If a retiree filed the Westfield form already, can or should he/she file again using the updated form prepared by PARA's attorneys? Yes. PARA's attorneys strongly recommend that he/she file the updated form, and be sure to label it: "REVISED NOTICE OF CLAIM FORM."
- Is PARA or its attorneys bringing a class action suit over the E-ZPass matter against the Port Authority? No.
- Then who is? No law firm we are aware of is bringing a class action against the Port Authority regarding the loss of the E-ZPass benefit. However, Tom Westfield is actively seeking a law firm willing to bring a class action.
- Is a class action suit a "done deal?" No. But by filing a timely Notice of Claim, a retiree is keeping the option open to be part of a class action suit should it go forward, and it keeps the option open to sue the Port Authority individually. Retirees who fail to file a timely Notice of Claim will lose their right to sue, either individually or as part of a class action.
- What is the filing deadline? PARA recommends that forms be **received** by the Port Authority by **Wednesday, September 14**, which should avoid any challenge to the timeliness of the filing. A Notice of Claim form **must be sworn to before a notary, and sent via Registered Mail - Return Receipt Requested**.
- If a retiree files a Notice of Claim, is that a commitment to sue the Port Authority? No. It just keeps the option open until November 17 to commence litigation.
- Whom do I notify if I filed a Notice of Claim on the Port Authority? Tom Westfield, at EZPassLitigation@aol.com.
- Is PARA taking a position on whether or not to file a Notice of Claim? No. We are trying to provide the best information we can so that our members can make intelligent decisions in the matter. PARA cannot give legal advice other than that you discuss the matter with your own legal adviser.







As you are aware, I have been working on developing a strategy to deal with the E-ZPass problem. Since the PA can only be sued by persons who have filed Notice that they wish to proceed against them, I believe every retiree should file a Notice of Claim indicating they wish to sue for this benefit.

Under the law you have to tell the PA you are suing them by sending a Notice that outlines who you are, where you live, the basis for your claim, and it must be notarized. Once that's sent by Registered Mail, return receipt, you have to wait 60 days to institute the suit which has to be accomplished within one year of the date the claim originated. A number of attorneys have suggested a class action may exist consisting of all persons who filed timely Notices of Claim.

I have included a copy of a Notice of Claim which can be filled out and sent to the PA. It must be notarized and sent by registered mail or delivered in person. The sooner this is done, the sooner the class will be determined and we can get the process started.

When you file, PA Civilian retirees are encouraged to file as well, I would appreciate if you would notify me by email at _____ that you have filed. Please include your retirement status such as PBA, SBA, LBA, DEA or CIV. If you have a scanner, a copy of the filed Notice would be helpful also.

Dear Brothers and Sisters

As you are aware, I have been working on developing a strategy to deal with the EZPass problem. Since the PA can only be sued by persons who have filed Notice that they wish to proceed against them, I believe every retiree should file a Notice of Claim indicating they wish to sue for this benefit.

Under the law you have to tell the PA you are suing them by sending a Notice that outlines who you are, where you live, the basis for your claim, and it must be notarized. Once that's sent by Registered Mail, return receipt, you have to wait 60 days to institute the suit which has to be accomplished within one year of the date the claim originated. A number of attorneys have suggested a class action may exist consisting of all persons who filed timely Notices of Claim.

I have included a copy of a Notice of Claim which can be filled out and sent to the PA. It must be notarized and sent by registered mail or delivered in person. The sooner this is done, the sooner the class will be determined and we can get the process started.

When you file, PA Civilian retirees are encouraged to file as well, I would appreciate if you would notify me by email at EZPassLitigation@aol.com that you have filed. Please include your retirement status such as PBA, SBA, LBA, DEA or CIV. If you have a scanner, a copy of the filed Notice would be helpful also. .

I urge every retiree, regardless of your represented status or not, wherever you live, or even if you don't think you will ever use this benefit, to FILE. Erosion of benefits now will embolden the PA in the future. Your medical benefits may be next!!

Thanks for listening, and please pass this on to any Port Authority retirees and their associations that you may have contact with. File as soon as you can, our strength lies in numbers. The Port Authority will not ignore the thousands of Claims they get!
