This is in response to your January 23, 2014 request, which has been processed under the Port Authority's Freedom of Information Code (the "Code", copy attached) for copies of records over the past five years for (1) spending on economic development programs, (2) charitable contributions made by the Port Authority, (3) a list of the Port Authority association fees and memberships and (4) expense reports for Commissioners, Executive directors and Deputy Executive Directors as well as a list of current professional service providers with business addresses.

In an effort to provide available documents as quickly as possible, we are responding to a portion of your request at this time. We will continue the processing of your request as expeditiously as possible and to the extent that our review would permit us to provide you with additional responsive documents while the review is ongoing, we will endeavor to do so.

Material responsive to (1) and (2) of your request and available under the Code can be found on the Port Authority's website at <http://www.panynj.gov/corporate-information/foi/14604-O.pdf>. Paper copies of the available records are available upon request.

As presently written, your request for a list of current professional service providers is overly broad and cannot be processed under the Code. The Code provides for the copying or inspection of Port Authority records when such request contains sufficient information to identify the particular record(s) sought. Such requests must not be overly broad, but must be as detailed as possible and provide, at a minimum, a clear description of the Record or type of Record being sought. Requests seeking "any and all records" regarding a facility, project, contract, or other activity are overly broad. You may wish to resubmit this portion of your request to clearly define the specific records being requested.

We anticipate that it will take at least three weeks for us to complete the processing of the remainder of your request.
