

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Policy on Support for Civic and Community Projects, Programs and Services

The Committee on Operations reported that the Port Authority receives numerous requests to support various philanthropic causes. The Port Authority cooperates significantly in connection with public fund raising campaigns by philanthropic organizations. It permits solicitation of funds at its public terminal facilities subject to appropriate rules and regulations. Where the particular program is of benefit to a Port Authority facility or otherwise related to the Port Authority's authorized purposes pursuant to its statutory responsibilities, the Port Authority may provide financial support. However, with respect to other philanthropic efforts, the Port Authority as a public agency responsible for public funds received for specific public purposes does not contribute such funds, however worthy the cause.

To insure proper control and coordination of this program, the Port Authority will prepare annually a schedule for such proposed direct financial support, including allocations by facility, in conjunction with the preparation of the Port Authority's annual budget. This schedule will be submitted to the Operations Committee prior to submission to the Board. At the same time a report will be submitted of payments made during the past year listing recipients of amounts over \$1,000.

The Committee recommended that the Board adopt a policy in regard to contributions of money to non-profit service organizations.

Whereupon, the following resolution was unanimously adopted:

RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey hereby adopts the following policy in regard to contributions of money by the Port Authority to non-profit service organizations:

1. the Port Authority, as a public agency responsible for public funds received for specific public purposes does not contribute such funds for general philanthropic purposes, however worthy the cause;
2. specific and appropriate financial assistance to civic and community projects, programs and services related to the Port Authority's authorized purposes pursuant to its statutory responsibilities, including those which provide a benefit or service to a Port Authority facility, may be provided;

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Executive Director be and he hereby is authorized to promulgate a plan for administration of such expenditures by Department Directors

and facility managers, such plan to include (a) submission of a schedule for proposed financial support, including recipients, or categories of recipients, and the respective items, to be reviewed initially by the Committee on Operations and finally by the Board. in conjunction with the review of the Annual Budget, (b) delegation to facility managers of authority to provide financial assistance, in such amounts as the Executive Director may determine, to community service organizations in their areas, and (c) the Executive Director to have authority to authorize expenditures for individual eligible purposes not described in the schedule reviewed as part of the Annual Budget.
