Event Management Organization Chart



- A medical plan to service patrons when needed as well as a detailed evacuation plan relating to natural and or man-made crisis will be addressed
- Lastly, we will work hand in hand and side by side with all stakeholders to ultimately present a safe, well organized, and successful event for all parties involved

Food & Beverages

Vendors will have food vending license and food handler licenses. Food vendors will also be required to have general liability insurance.

All tents will have side walls to enclose the structure if needed. Typically (3) sides would remain on the tent and the (4th) side left open.

We will provide all necessary ballasting (concrete) to anchor tents and will be rated to withstand wind gusts typical along the pier location. A HWAP (high wind action plan) will reflect the ballasting layout.

We will provide all flame retardant certificates for each tent and will distribute copies of the certificates to the PARM. Every tent will be ballasted and every tent will have the flame certificates posted inside the tent.

All tents will have **one to three (1-3)** Fire Extinguishers inside in a designated area and posted near a Security / Fire Guard.

Security

We will provide a licensed and bonded NYC Security Firm to staff all necessary positions to insure a successful and safe event, which include but not limited to:

- Bag Check at Entrance
- Security to facilitate entry and exit to terminal
- All Production positions in control area (stage, front of house, backstage, near water)
- Site and Perimeter Security Patrols
- Working hand in hand with PA Security requirements

The Producer will arrange to provide licensed and trained security guards to process and manage patron attending Escape Music Series at Pier 9 Red Hook Container Terminal proposed for Saturday & Sunday October 11 & 12, 2014. The event will open at 1pm and end at 11pm. Security and setup will begin on or about October 9, 2014.

The plans calls for approximately 8,000 pre-ticketed patrons to enter the Red Hook Container Terminal. They will come by taxi, subway, ferry, and will enter the premises on foot at Degraw Street. Base building lighting will be powered on an emergency power circuit to maintain minimum lighting levels for egress in case of power outage.

Passenger drop-off areas on the city streets will be designated in coordination with NYPD.

There will be separate areas for buses and automobiles (POV and taxis).

Bus loading and drop off will be the same area. The Producer will work with NYPD/NYC DOT to restrict parking allocated for these areas.



Street. There will be fenced in walkways to guide the patrons through ticketing check-points and chutes, where Security will search all attendees and bags. They will use "pat down" procedures. No weapons, cans, bottles, liquid, hard objects, illicit substances, or banned items will be permitted inside.

Security will staff emergency exits, have fixed perimeter posts, stage & backstage, delay sound and video tower positions, and zone response teams.

Security will wear visible bright colored shirts, clearly identifiable with a unique number for each Security Guard. All activity within the venue will be closely monitored by placing staff in strategic observational positions, as well as by response teams.

Security will work closely with Authorities and provide accurate intelligence regarding the operations of the concert, in advance, and throughout the Event, in order to insure public safety and meet concerts.

Pre-Event meetings as deemed necessary will be held to coordinate among the PA Police Department and the security teams. It is understood that jurisdiction, and the responsibility for setting police and protocols, lies with the PA and PA Police Department.

Communications

To facilitate communications at the event, the Producer will rent **Ten (10)** walkie-talkies.

The radio channels will be designated to allow various functions to interact directly. Namely, the channels will correspond to function as follows:

- Administration
- Balearic Entertainment Management
- Hospitality
- Operations
- Police/Security
- Cleaning
- First Aid
- Tent Contractor/Electrical Services

All relevant entities, subcontractors, event staff, etc. will receive radios. Relevant PA personnel, including on-site representatives, Police and First Aid/EMS, will be on the distribution list.

It remains to be coordinated how "outside" resources are contacted, specifically the NYPD and NYFD. The event is ready to have the PA Police Department be responsible for contacting these agencies; otherwise the Producer and the Security Firm will take the lead in establishing communications as needed come the weekend of the event.

Additionally, the on-site contact list will afford direct phone connect. However, the above mentioned radios will serve as the primary communication tool. The producers will provide a full list of contact numbers prior to the show.

Fire Safety

There will be 70-80 fireguards stationed throughout the facility. These are noted on the sitemap.

Water Safety

There will be safety barricades between the patrons and the water. In addition, there will be various security personnel stations and/or patrolling the perimeter of the Pier.

The Producer will notify and coordinate with NYPD Marine personnel along with the Coast Guard. Life vests and water rescue equipment will be stored at multiple locations along the perimeter.

Crowd Control

Patrons will enter the facility on Degraw Street. There will be barricades and security personnel guiding the patrons from the entrance to Pier 9. We have allocated 4 square feet per person close to the stages. As you will notice on the site map, this will take up less than 25% of space on the Pier. In all likelihood, the crowd will be significantly more dispersed at other places (food and concession vendors, bathrooms, the 2nd stage, along the Pier and facility, and relax areas).

Patrons will also exit on Degraw Street. We will coordinate with the traffic division of NYPD.

We will create an egress plan that will utilize the new gate to be installed at the Degraw Street entrance. This entrance is reflected on our updated site plan.

Emergency Evacuation

In the event of an emergency, patrons will have access to the safety barrier surrounding the Pier. They will be directed by security and fire safety personnel to 3 emergency exits (Degraw, Terminal Entrance at Hamilton and Van Brunt and Columbia Street). Columbia and the Terminal Entrance exits will be walled off and only accessible during an emergency.

Site Map Note

The site map is designed using a grid system for an easier way to find and locate any emergency situations or for simple ease of finding items around the concert site.

Medical

Producer will have EMS on site and ALS service will be offered

Hours of Operation: Beginning approximately 13:00 hours on each event date

Ending approximately 24:00 hours each date

Medical Staffing



CSS Support staff has been providing event support staff services for over thirty eight years in the tri-state region and has been recognized a valuable partner in event planning and implementation process.

The CSS support staff team provides fully screened and highly trained personnel who are experienced in the field of Special Events. The CSS Director will be on site to provide overall support staff coordination.

All support staff members of CSS are registered with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice. Each licensed support staff member has attended and passed the New York State mandated curriculum, pass a criminal background check, maintained a clean criminal record, attended the required annual New York State training class and received many additional hours of company and site specific training.

After visiting the Red Hook Container Terminal, surveying the neighborhood, reviewing the site plans, meeting the terminal operator, event promoter, NYNJ Port Authority Police a preliminary support staff and safety plan has been created. Audience Load In

Entrance Line Control.

The main entrance will be through the gate at where Degraw Street meets the terminal property line. The area inside the gate will be large enough to create a cue the line on the Red Hood Container Terminal Property. A soft check for tickets will be conducted at that point to minimize un-ticketed patrons from entering the cue line. Inside the property, metal barricade may be used to create a serpentine chute which will allow guests to experience progress as they advance. This cue system will greatly reduce the events impact on the local community.

Safety Check

A safety check will be administered in an effort to insure the safety of all persons entering the site.

The promoter will create a list of prohibited items. This list will be published on the website and further disseminated, in advance of the event, to ticket holders via email. On event day, large signs listing the prohibited items will be visible for all attendees to see prior to entering the search area. This notification will allow guests to voluntarily leave to find a safe harbor for their prohibited items. If the guest declines the opportunity to store their prohibited items site they will be required to dispose of the items in the trash bins located at the search area. This must be completed before being granted access to the event site. No provision for the return of such items will be made. The disposed items will be picked up by the trash removal team though out the course of the event.

Each attendee will be subjected to a voluntary safety inspection beginning with a bag check followed by a physical pat down. Legal prohibited items will be voluntarily disposed by the patron in the trash bins. Patrons in possession illegal prohibited items such as guns or distribution quantity of drugs, will be turned over to law enforcement for further investigation.

Ticket Takers

CSS will provide ticket scan operators. These support personnel will operate hand held ticket scanners to assure each patron has a valid ticket. Once the ticket has been scanned and validated, the holder will be permitted to enter the event grounds. Patrons who have tickets which fail to validate will be sent to an area known as ticket resolution. Those who cannot resolve their ticket issues will be escorted off of the property.

Alcohol Age Banding

Patrons who have entered the event and intend to consume alcoholic beverages will need to present legal government issued ID proving that they are of legal age to purchase and consume alcohol. Those who qualify will be wrist banded with an "over 21" wrist band.

Alcohol Compliance

Float teams and redeployed ID Banders will patrol the site for un-banded alcohol consumption. Persons spotted consuming alcohol will first be challenged to produce valid government issued ID which confirms they are of legal age to drink. If the ID is produced and they are in fact over 21 an "over 21" wrist band will be applied. If the individual cannot prove they are 21 or older they will be immediately escorted off the property. Anyone who has been banded as "over 21" and is observed facilitating underage drinking will be immediately escorted off for the site.

Concept

The producer proposes to do a 2-day weekend concert series for October 2014. It will be a combination of electronic and indie rock music. The event will be 19+. We aim to target a demographic in their mid to late 20's.

There will be some festival amenities including food vendors, a VIP area, craft vendors, body painting, games, activities, interactive environments, and art exhibits.

This will require a capacity of 8,000 people

The event will operate from 1pm-11pm each event day

Operating Plan

As Producer, we will provide a site plan specific to Red Hook that will comply with the expectations and protocols of the venue and PA.

Our production plan will include the following:

- Our design on site will be in 100% compliance with all PA codes
- We will present an egress / access plan for all attendees
- A fully detailed operations plan will be put together to address crowd flow and the impending effects on the local community
- We will provide the necessary Security Guards in compliance with the PA certified stipulations
- We will provide a plan to address all issues in accordance with the ADA
- Within the Red Hook Operations Plan, our detailed transportation and communication procedure will be set forth
- A medical plan to service patrons when needed as well as a detailed evacuation plan relating to natural and or man-made crisis will be addressed
- Lastly, we will work hand in hand and side by side with all stakeholders to ultimately present a safe, well organized, and successful event for all parties involved

Food & Beverages

Vendors will have food vending license and food handler licenses. Food vendors will also be required to have general liability insurance.

Vendors will supply current New York City Department of Health & Mental Hygiene Permit to Operate a Food Establishment

Food vendors will be required to follow the procedures and protocols set forth in the Special Events Food Safety Requirements document.

Tents

- There will be (15-20) 10' x 15' tents to house vendors
- There will be (1) 40' x 60' tent for hospitality area located backstage
- There will be (1) 40' x 60' tent for VIP located at the left of the main stage
- There will be (2) 20' x 20' Medical Tents

All tents will have side walls to enclose the structure if needed. Typically (3) sides would remain on the tent and the (4th) side left open.

We will provide all necessary ballasting (concrete) to anchor tents and will be rated to withstand wind gusts typical along the pier location. A HWAP (high wind action plan) will reflect the ballasting layout.

We will provide all flame retardant certificates for each tent and will distribute copies of the certificates to the PARM. Every tent will be ballasted and every tent will have the flame certificates posted inside the tent.

All tents will have **one to three (1-3)** Fire Extinguishers inside in a designated area and posted near a Security / Fire Guard.

Security

We will provide a licensed and bonded NYC Security Firm to staff all necessary positions to insure a successful and safe event, which include but not limited to:

- Bag Check at Entrance
- Security to facilitate entry and exit to terminal
- All Production positions in control area (stage, front of house, backstage, near water)
- Site and Perimeter Security Patrols
- Working hand in hand with PA Security requirements

The Producer will arrange to provide licensed and trained security guards to process and manage patron attending Escape Music Series at Pier 9 Red Hook Container Terminal proposed for Saturday & Sunday October 11 & 12, 2014. The event will open at 1pm and end at 11pm. Security and setup will begin on or about October 9, 2014.

All relevant entities, subcontractors, event staff, etc. will receive radios. Relevant PA personnel, including on-site representatives, Police and First Aid/EMS, will be on the distribution list.

It remains to be coordinated how "outside" resources are contacted, specifically the NYPD and NYFD. The event is ready to have the PA Police Department be responsible for contacting these agencies; otherwise the Producer and the Security Firm will take the lead in establishing communications as needed come the weekend of the event.

Additionally, the on-site contact list will afford direct phone connect. However, the above mentioned radios will serve as the primary communication tool. The producers will provide a full list of contact numbers prior to the show.

Fire Safety

A Fire Safety Director will be present from setup through the event to load-out and cleanup of event.

There will be 80 fireguards stationed throughout the facility. These are noted on the sitemap.

Pier 9 is approximately 230,000 square feet. At a requirement of 8 extinguishers per 40,000 square feet, we will have 48 extinguishers on site (Extinguishers shall be A:B:C type).

Egress

Base building lighting will be powered on an emergency power circuit to maintain minimum lighting levels for egress in case of power outage.

Passenger drop-off areas on the city streets will be designated in coordination with NYPD.

There will be separate areas for buses and automobiles (POV and taxis).

Bus loading and drop off will be the same area. The Producer will work with NYPD/ NYC DOT to restrict parking allocated for these areas.

Site Map Note

The site map is designed using a grid system for an easier way to find and locate any emergency situations or for simple ease of finding items around the concert site.

Medical

Producer will have EMS on site and ALS service will be offered

Hours of Operation: Beginning approximately 13:00 hours on each event date

Ending approximately 24:00 hours each date

Medical Staffing

1. All staff working at "Escape Music Series" will be certified at the appropriate level
2. Auxiliary staff. Medical Director available on-site or by radio at all times
3. All staff are instructed to report 15 minutes prior to their scheduled shift. An afternoon briefing for all staff will be held.

Producer shall supply **one (1)** ambulance vehicle on-site at the concert. All vehicles will be staffed according to PA protocols.

We will provide **two (2)** Medical Tents on site. Each 20' x 20' tent will be fully enclosed with proper exit signs posted. The tent will be climate controlled.

Charity

The Producer will donate 1% of GA Ticket sales to Hurricane Sandy Relief and/or local Red Hook Community projects.



Insurance Procured By The Contractor

The Contractor shall take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Commercial General Liability and Legal Liquor Liability Insurances, including but not limited to premises-operations and products-completed operations, broad form property damage and independent contractors coverage, with contractual liability language covering the obligations assumed by the Permittee under this Contract and, if vehicles are to be used to carry out the performance of this Contract, then the Permittee shall also take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Automobile Liability Insurance covering owned, non-owned, and hired autos in the following minimum limits:

Commercial General Liability Insurance - \$ 6 million combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.

Automobile Liability Insurance - \$ 6 million combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability.

Concession & Liquor Liability Insurance - \$ 5 million per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage.

In addition, the liability policy (ies) shall name "The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey and its related entities, The City of New York and its related entities as additional insured", including but not limited to premise-operations, products-completed operations on the Commercial General Liability Policy. Moreover, the Commercial General Liability Policy shall not contain any provisions for exclusions from liability other than provisions for exclusion from liability forming part of the most up to date ISO form or its equivalent unendorsed Commercial General Liability Policy. The liability policy (ies) and certificate of insurance shall contain separation of insured condition and severability of interests so that coverage will respond as if separate policies were in force for each insured. These insurance requirements shall be in effect for the duration of the contract to include any warrantee/guarantee period.

The certificate of insurance and policy (ies) must contain the following endorsement for the above liability coverages:

"The insurer shall not, without obtaining the express advance written permission from the General Counsel of the Port Authority, raise any defense involving in any way the jurisdiction of the Tribunal over the person of the Port Authority, the immunity of the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents or employees, the governmental nature of the Port Authority, or the provisions of any statutes respecting suits against the Port Authority."

The Permittee shall also take out, maintain, and pay premiums on Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the requirements of law in the state(s) where work will take place, including Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1 million each accident.

Each policy above shall contain a provision that the policy may not be canceled, terminated, or modified without thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, Att: Facility Administrator, at the location where the event will take place and to the General Manager, Risk Management.

Within five (5) days after the award of this agreement or contract and prior to the start of work, the Permittee must submit an original certificate of insurance, to the Port Authority, Facility Administrator, at the location where the event will take place. This certificate of insurance MUST show evidence of the above insurance policy(ies), stating the agreement/contract number prior to the start of the event. Upon request by the Port Authority, the Permittee shall furnish to the General Manager, Risk Management, a certified copy of each policy, including the premiums.

Renewal certificates or policies shall be delivered to the Facility Administrator, Port Authority at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration date of each expiring policy. If at any time any of the certificates or policies shall become unsatisfactory to the Port Authority, the Permittee shall promptly obtain a new and satisfactory certificate and policy.

The requirements for insurance procured by the Permittee shall not in any way be construed as a limitation on the nature or extent of the contractual obligations assumed by the Permittee under this contract. The insurance requirements is not a representation by the Port Authority of NY and NJ and its related entities as to the adequacy of the insurance to protect the Permittee against the obligations imposed on them by law or by this or any other Contract.

Escape Music Festival Food Plan

There will be 20-25 food vendors total. This will be a combination of tented vendors and food trucks. The festival will supply tents and the power infrastructure to support the vendors. All vendors will be using electricity provided, there will be no open flame or gas.

Load in for equipment will be Friday from 12-6. Food load-in will be available in the morning both days of the event. Load out will occur Monday morning from 9-3. There will be parking on premises for food vendors.

All Vendors are aware of and will be adhering to the following criteria:

- Provide the name and address of all food suppliers and the specific food they will be providing.
- Provide a copy of the current New York City Department of Health & Mental Hygiene Permit to Operate a Food Establishment (or the appropriate jurisdiction) from each food supplier.
- Provide a list of all menu items that will be served.
- Provide metal stem type thermometers (or thermocouple type) for employees to verify food temperatures. In addition, provide alcohol swabs for cleaning thermometers in between use. Instruct employees on the proper use of thermometers.
- Verify that all food products, when picked up/received from suppliers, are at the proper temperature – 41 degrees F. for cold products and 140 degrees F. for hot products.



Products must be transported in properly insulated containers.

- Provide details on the procedures that will be implemented to ensure that when food is on display or in storage, that employees are ensuring that proper temperatures are maintained – 41 degrees F. for cold and 140 degrees F. for hot. All cold food must be displayed on ice. Ice should be at same level as food. Display type refrigeration units should be utilized if available.
- If using refrigeration units, refrigeration must be set at 33 – 38 degrees F. in order to maintain food at 41 degrees F. and must be operating at those temperatures prior to placing food inside refrigerator.
- When food is placed on display, it should be covered or protected by sneeze guards or equivalent
- Ensure that hot holding units are at the proper temperature prior to displaying food.
- Limit the amount of food on display.
- Provide sanitizing stations by serving area for employees. Employees must be provided with gloves. The gloves should be changed frequently and employees should use the sanitizer when changing gloves.
- Employees should wear hair restraints and clean outer clothing (disposable aprons, etc.).
- If using coolers to store food the coolers must be stored off the ground.



CSS Support staff has been providing event support staff services for over thirty eight years in the tri-state region and has been recognized a valuable partner in event planning and implementation process.

The CSS support staff team provides fully screened and highly trained personnel who are experienced in the field of Special Events. The CSS Director will be on site to provide overall support staff coordination.

All support staff members of CSS are registered with the New York State Division of Criminal Justice. Each licensed support staff member has attended and passed the New York State mandated curriculum, pass a criminal background check, maintained a clean criminal record, attended the required annual New York State training class and received many additional hours of company and site specific training.

After visiting the Red Hook Container Terminal, surveying the neighborhood, reviewing the site plans, meeting the terminal operator, event promoter, NYNJ Port Authority Police a preliminary support staff and safety plan has been created. This plan will be update after the final overall event plan is completed


Entrance Line Control.

The main entrance will be through the gate at where Degraw Street meets the terminal property line. The area inside the gate will be large enough to create a cue the line on the Red Hood Container Terminal Property. A soft check for tickets will be conducted at that point to minimize un-ticketed patrons from entering the cue line. Inside the property, metal barricade may be used to create a serpentine chute which will allow guests to experience progress as they advance. This cue system will greatly reduce the events impact on the local community.

Safety Check

A safety check will be administered in an effort to insure the safety of all persons entering the site.

The promoter will create a list of prohibited items. This list will be published on the website and further disseminated, in advance of the event, to ticket holders via email. On event day, large signs listing the prohibited items will be visible for all attendees to see

prior to entering the search area. This notification will allow guests to voluntarily leave to find a safe harbor for their prohibited items. If the guest declines the opportunity to store their prohibited items site they will be required to dispose of the items in the trash bins located at the search area. This must be completed before being granted access to the event site. No provision for the return of such items will be made. The disposed items will be picked up by the trash removal team though out the course of the event. Each attendee will be subjected to a voluntary safety inspection beginning with a bag check followed by a physical pat down. Legal prohibited items will be voluntarily disposed by the patron in the trash bins. Patrons in possession illegal prohibited items such as guns or distribution quantity of drugs, will be turned over to law enforcement for further investigation.

Ticket Takers

CSS will provide ticket scan operators. These support personnel will operated hand held tickets scanners to assure each patron has a valid ticket. Once the ticket has been scanned and validated, the holder will permitted to enter the event grounds. Patrons who have tickets which fail to validate will be sent an area known as ticket resolution. Those who cannot resolve their ticket issues will be escorted off of the property.

Alcohol Age Banding

Patrons who have entered the event and intend to consume alcoholic beverages will need to present legal government issued ID proving that they are of legal age to purchase and consume alcohol. Those who qualify will be wrist banded with an "over 21" wrist band.

Alcohol Compliance


Float teams and redeployed ID Banders will patrol the site for un-banded alcohol consumption. Persons spotted consuming alcohol will first be challenged to produce valid government issued ID which confirms they are of legal age to drink. If the ID is produced and they are in fact over 21 an "over 21" wrist band will be applied. If the individual is cannot prove they are 21 or older they will be immediately escorted off the property. Anyone who has been banded as "over 21" and is observed facilitating underage drinking will be immediately escorted off for the site.

 2. Securing the Rescuer
 3. "Hooking" the victim
 4. Retrieval of victim
- C. Throw

- D. Basic First Aid topics
 1. Abrasions, Punctures, Lacerations
 2. Shock
 3. Hypothermia
 4. Broken Bones

Note:

- You should obtain Safety Hooks with extensions that will reach 3-4' out from the pier at Mean Lower Low Water for that area.
- You should obtain heaving Line lengths for safety ring of not less than 50' of buoyant line.
- Some type of ladders to aid in retrieval should the victim be able to climb, otherwise in-water retrieval.

Walking Route to B63 Bus



SITE MAP #4 – Entry Area Cues






SITE MAP #5 – Area Map







Primary Exit Route #1







Dear Mr. Creighton:

Subject to all the terms and conditions of this letter agreement, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (the "Port Authority") hereby grants permission to the permittee set forth below (the "Permittee") to use the space designated below (the "Space") for the purpose described below and for no other purpose whatsoever:

Permittee: Vice Media, Inc., a(n) Delaware corporation

Facility: Brooklyn-Port Authority Marine Terminal

Space: Pier 9A at the Red Hook Container Terminal, or such area, or areas, of the Facility as shall be designated from time to time by the Facility Manager, or his or her authorized designee.

Purpose: For the Absolut Nights Marketing Event, including filming of Absolut Night Music Video. Alcohol will be served at this event, and the Permittee shall not serve more than one (1) drink per hour to individuals. All alcohol will only be served by licensed bartenders and the Permittee will have security personnel on hand during this event. This agreement only serves this purpose, and no other purpose whatsoever.

Effective Date: September 12, 2014 at 6 o'clock a.m..

Expiration Date: September 13, 2014 at 10 o'clock p.m. unless sooner terminated in accordance with the following terms and conditions.

Minimum Administrative Charge: Forty-Two Thousand Twenty-Three Dollars and No Cents (\$42,023.00).

Minimum Limits of Required Insurance Coverages:

\$10,000,000.00 Commercial General Liability
\$ 5,000,000.00 Automobile Liability
\$ 0 Aircraft General and Aircraft Operator's Liability
\$ 0 Helicopter Liability
Statutory - Workers Compensation and Employer's Liability

1. This permission is subject to the condition that all operations and activities of the Permittee shall be conducted only at such times and under such conditions as may be approved by the Facility Manager to insure that the same can be conducted without interfering with other activities and operations at the Facility. The Permittee hereby agrees not to use or have any equipment or permit any condition to exist or to conduct the Permittee's operations or activities so as to interfere with or compromise the safe and efficient operation of the Facility. The Permittee shall contact the above named Facility staff member at the telephone number listed above prior to the Effective Date hereof to coordinate all details of the proposed use of the Space.

2. If the Port Authority, in its sole discretion, determines that any of the Permittee's activities in the Space or at the Facility interfere with other activities and operations at the Facility, the Permittee shall immediately cease all operations hereunder.

3. The Permittee is granted the use of the Space hereunder on a non-exclusive basis and acknowledges that it may occupy the Space contemporaneously with use thereof by the general public and other lessees or permittees of the Port Authority at the Facility.

4. (a) The Permittee hereby agrees to pay to the Port Authority the greater of (i) the sum of (x) one hundred forty percent (140%) of all Port Authority costs and expenses resulting from or incurred in connection with its operations or activities hereunder including, but not limited to, wages and materials (the "Port Authority Costs") and (y) the daily facility use charge, if any, for the operations and activities of the Permittee as contemplated hereunder as such charge is determined by the Facility Manager (the "Facility Use Charge") and (ii) the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above.

(b) Upon the Permittee's execution and delivery of this agreement, the Permittee shall pay to the Port Authority the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above. At the conclusion of the Permittee's operations hereunder, the Port Authority will determine all of the Port Authority Costs in connection with the Permittee's operations and activities hereunder. If the sum of the Port Authority Costs and the Facility Use Charge, if any, is in excess of the said Minimum Administrative Charge, then the Permittee shall pay such excess to the Port Authority upon demand. In the event the Minimum Administrative Charge is less than the sum of the Port Authority Costs and the Facility Use Charge, if any, the Permittee understands and agrees that it shall not be entitled to any refund, credit or allowance.

5. (a) The Permittee acknowledges that the Port Authority shall have no obligation to keep the Space, or any portion thereof, guarded, attended or patrolled and the Permittee further acknowledges that the Port Authority will have no liability of any kind whatsoever for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee or for which the Permittee is responsible placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. Without limiting the foregoing, the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees of and from any and all claims and demands including claims and demands of third persons for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee, or for which the Permittee is responsible, placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. In addition to the foregoing, the Permittee shall be the insurer of the Port Authority against the risk of loss or damage arising out of the Permittee's operations to any Port Authority fixtures, equipment and personal property which are a part of or are located in or on the Space and shall promptly replace or repair the same within five (5) days of such loss or damage. Further, the Permittee shall repair, replace or rebuild all or any part of the Space or the Facility which may be damaged or destroyed by the acts or omissions of the Permittee or those of its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Facility. The Port Authority shall have no duty of repair or maintenance as to the Space or any fixtures, equipment or personal property which is located in or on the Space and the Permittee shall accept the same in their "as is" condition.

(b) The Permittee hereby assumes all risks involved in the use of the Space and the Facility under this agreement and the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and demands of third parties including, but not limited to, those for personal injuries (including death) and for property damages arising out of or resulting from the Permittee's operations at the Space and the Facility under this agreement or arising out of or resulting from any acts or omissions hereunder on the part of the Permittee, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Space and the Facility.

6. (a) The Permittee in its name as insured shall secure and pay the premium on a policy of Commercial General Liability Insurance including, but not limited to Premises-Operations and Products-Completed Operations with a Contractual Liability Endorsement for such coverage as shall be stipulated by the Port Authority covering the Permittee's operations hereunder which insurance shall be in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, for each occurrence bodily injury and property damage. In addition, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Automobile Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired vehicles. Further, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Aircraft General Liability and Aircraft Operator's Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired aircraft. In addition, included in the above policy shall be Helicopter Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily

injury or property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired helicopters including passenger helicopters. In addition to the insurance required by this paragraph, the Permittee shall maintain in effect during the entire period hereunder Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance coverage providing full benefits as required by law. The Port Authority shall be named as an additional insured in each such policy required by this agreement, except for Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance, unless the Port Authority directs otherwise, and shall contain a provision that the policies may not be cancelled, terminated or modified without thirty (30) days' written notice to the Port Authority.

(b) As to any insurance required hereunder, a certified copy of each of the policies or a certificate or certificates evidencing the existence thereof, and all required endorsements, or binders, together with a certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance, shall be delivered to the Port Authority, Risk Financing Division, 225 Park Avenue South, 12th Floor, New York, New York 10003, Attn: Certificate Review, at least five (5) days prior to the Effective Date hereof. Each policy of insurance required hereunder shall contain a provision that the insurer shall not, without obtaining the express advance permission from the General Counsel of the Port Authority, raise any defense involving in any way the jurisdiction of the tribunal over the person of the Port Authority, the immunity of the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents or employees, the governmental nature of the Port Authority or the provisions of any statutes respecting suits against the Port Authority.

(c) The policies referred to in this paragraph shall contain an ISO standard "separation of insureds" clause or a cross liability endorsement providing that the protections afforded to the Permittee thereunder with respect to any claim or action against the Permittee by a third person shall pertain and apply with like effect with respect to any claim or action against the Permittee by the Port Authority and against the Port Authority by the Permittee, but such endorsement shall not limit, vary, change or affect the protections afforded the Port Authority thereunder as an additional insured.

(d) The policies referred to in this paragraph must be specifically endorsed to provide that the policy may not be canceled, terminated, or modified without thirty (30) days' written notice to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, General Manager, Risk Financing, at the address above.

7. Prior to the Effective Date hereof, the Permittee shall promptly supply, in detail, information regarding the nature of the activities contemplated to be performed hereunder and such other information regarding the Permittee's operations and activities hereunder as the Port Authority may reasonably request including, but not limited to, information regarding equipment and other property to be used by the Permittee in its operations or activities at the Facility. The Permittee agrees not to use any equipment or property to which the Port Authority may object and shall change the location of such property or equipment to another location if so directed by the Port Authority. Under no circumstances will the Permittee be permitted to use any hazardous equipment or materials including, but not limited to, firearms and explosives. Failure on the part of the Port Authority to object to the Permittee's operations or activities or to the use of any equipment or property or its location shall not be deemed

to be an approval thereof and the Permittee acknowledges that the Port Authority undertakes no duties or responsibilities of any kind in connection with information supplied by the Permittee and shall have no liability in connection therewith. Under the terms and provisions of this agreement, the Permittee shall not and shall not be permitted to engage in any operations or activities at any area at the Facility unless such operations or activities have been authorized by the Port Authority. The Permittee hereby acknowledges and agrees that all of its operations and activities at the Space and at the Facility shall be conducted at the highest degree of safety and care and be in strict conformity with procedures as may be established by the Port Authority.

8. Without the express written permission of the Port Authority, the Permittee shall not film, videotape or photograph or permit to be filmed, videotaped or photographed any scene or sequence identifying the Facility or any other Port Authority facility (or depicting any aspect thereof). The Permittee shall not use or permit the use in any scene of any vehicles, uniforms, signs or posters or dialogue, which in any way bear or carry the name of the Facility or the name of any other Port Authority facility.

9. The Permittee shall observe, comply with and execute the provisions of any and all present and future governmental laws, rules, regulations, requirements, orders and directions which may pertain or apply to the operations or activities of the Permittee hereunder. The Permittee shall observe and obey (and to compel its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees and those doing business with it to observe and obey) the Rules and Regulations of the Port Authority (a copy of which is available from the Facility Manager) for the government of the Permittee's conduct and operations and activities at the Facility. The operations and activities of the Permittee and those of its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees and those doing business with it shall be conducted in an orderly and proper manner so as not to annoy, disturb or be offensive to others at the Facility or interfere with the operations of the Facility and shall be in compliance with all procedures and directives established by the Manager of the Facility or his or her authorized designee. Further, the Permittee shall comply with any directives of the Facility Manager or his or her authorized designee.

10. All property, materials and equipment placed or installed in the Space by the Permittee pursuant to this agreement shall be removed therefrom immediately upon the expiration or earlier termination of this agreement.


11. This agreement may be terminated by the Port Authority without cause upon two (2) days' notice, however the Port Authority may immediately terminate this agreement if the Permittee shall fail to observe or is not in compliance with any of the terms and conditions of this agreement. Termination shall not relieve the Permittee of any obligations, which have accrued on or prior to termination.

12. No Commissioner, officer, agent or employee of the Port Authority shall be charged personally by the Permittee with any liability, or held liable to it, under any term or provision of this Permit, or because of its execution or attempted execution, or because of any breach hereof.

13. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on the subject matter and may be amended only in writing signed by the parties.

This agreement is forwarded in duplicate. If the terms of the agreement herein contained are satisfactory, the original and duplicate copy of this agreement should be signed by an authorized officer of the Permittee and returned promptly to the Port Authority. The return to the Permittee of a copy of this agreement executed on behalf of the Port Authority will place it into effect.





This Rider is made a part of the letter agreement, ala Permit, dated September 9, 2014, bearing number FLM-004BP (the "Permit") granting Vice Media, Inc. (the "Permittee") permission to conduct filming at Brooklyn-Port Authority Marine Terminal on September 12-13, 2014 by the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (the "Port Authority") for the purposes described in the Permit. All terms used herein and not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Permit.

The parties agree to modify the terms of the Permit as follows:

1. Paragraph 14: the following is added as Paragraph 14 of the Permit:

"14. This Permit and any claim, dispute or controversy arising out of, under or related to this Permit, the relationship of the parties hereunder, and/or the interpretation and enforcement of the rights and obligation of the parties hereunder shall be governed by, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without regard to choice of law principles. The Permittee and the Port Authority agree that any action at law or equity arising out of this Permit, including to enforce the terms of this Permit or to seek a remedy for breach thereof, shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction located in the County of Kings of the State of New York, and the Permittee and the Port Authority agree that neither party will object to any such action being brought in such court on the ground that the court lacks personal jurisdiction, or that venue is improper or inconvenient."

Subject to all the terms and conditions of this letter agreement, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (the "Port Authority") hereby grants permission to the permittee set forth below (the "Permittee") to use the space designated below (the "Space") for the purpose described below and for no other purpose whatsoever:

Permittee: Vice Media, Inc., a(n) Delaware corporation

Facility: Brooklyn-Port Authority Marine Terminal

Space: Pier 9A at the Red Hook Container Terminal, or such area, or areas, of the Facility as shall be designated from time to time by the Facility Manager, or his or her authorized designee.

Purpose: For the Absolut Nights Marketing Event, including filming of Absolut Night Music Video. Alcohol will be served at this event, and the Permittee shall not serve more than one (1) drink per hour to individuals. All alcohol will only be served by licensed bartenders and the Permittee will have security personnel on hand during this event. This agreement only serves this purpose, and no other purpose whatsoever.

1. This permission is subject to the condition that all operations and activities of the Permittee shall be conducted only at such times and under such conditions as may be approved by the Facility Manager to insure that the same can be conducted without interfering with other activities and operations at the Facility. The Permittee hereby agrees not to use or have any equipment or permit any condition to exist or to conduct the Permittee's operations or activities so as to interfere with or compromise the safe and efficient operation of the Facility. The Permittee shall contact the above named Facility staff member at the telephone number listed above prior to the Effective Date hereof to coordinate all details of the proposed use of the Space.

2. If the Port Authority, in its sole discretion, determines that any of the Permittee's activities in the Space or at the Facility interfere with other activities and operations at the Facility, the Permittee shall immediately cease all operations hereunder.

3. The Permittee is granted the use of the Space hereunder on a non-exclusive basis and acknowledges that it may occupy the Space contemporaneously with use thereof by the general public and other lessees or permittees of the Port Authority at the Facility.

4. (a) The Permittee hereby agrees to pay to the Port Authority the greater of (i) the sum of (x) one hundred forty percent (140%) of all Port Authority costs and expenses resulting from or incurred in connection with its operations or activities hereunder including, but not limited to, wages and materials (the "Port Authority Costs") and (y) the daily facility use charge, if any, for the operations and activities of the Permittee as contemplated hereunder as such charge is determined by the Facility Manager (the "Facility Use Charge") and (ii) the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above.

(b) Upon the Permittee's execution and delivery of this agreement, the Permittee shall pay to the Port Authority the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above. At the conclusion of the Permittee's operations hereunder, the Port Authority will determine all of the Port Authority Costs in connection with the Permittee's operations and activities hereunder. If the sum of the Port Authority Costs and the Facility Use Charge, if any, is in excess of the said Minimum Administrative Charge, then the Permittee shall pay such excess to the Port Authority upon demand. In the event the Minimum Administrative Charge is less than the sum of the Port

Authority Costs and the Facility Use Charge, if any, the Permittee understands and agrees that it shall not be entitled to any refund, credit or allowance.

5. (a) The Permittee acknowledges that the Port Authority shall have no obligation to keep the Space, or any portion thereof, guarded, attended or patrolled and the Permittee further acknowledges that the Port Authority will have no liability of any kind whatsoever for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee or for which the Permittee is responsible placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. Without limiting the foregoing, the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees of and from any and all claims and demands including claims and demands of third persons for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee, or for which the Permittee is responsible, placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. In addition to the foregoing, the Permittee shall be the insurer of the Port Authority against the risk of loss or damage arising out of the Permittee's operations to any Port Authority fixtures, equipment and personal property which are a part of or are located in or on the Space and shall promptly replace or repair the same within five (5) days of such loss or damage. Further, the Permittee shall repair, replace or rebuild all or any part of the Space or the Facility which may be damaged or destroyed by the acts or omissions of the Permittee or those of its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Facility. The Port Authority shall have no duty of repair or maintenance as to the Space or any fixtures, equipment or personal property which is located in or on the Space and the Permittee shall accept the same in their "as is" condition.

(b) The Permittee hereby assumes all risks involved in the use of the Space and the Facility under this agreement and the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and demands of third parties including, but not limited to, those for personal injuries (including death) and for property damages arising out of or resulting from the Permittee's operations at the Space and the Facility under this agreement or arising out of or resulting from any acts or omissions hereunder on the part of the Permittee, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Space and the Facility.

6. (a) The Permittee in its name as insured shall secure and pay the premium on a policy of Commercial General Liability Insurance including, but not limited to Premises-Operations and Products-Completed Operations with a Contractual Liability Endorsement for such coverage as shall be stipulated by the Port Authority covering the Permittee's operations hereunder which insurance shall be in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, for each occurrence bodily injury and property damage. In addition, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Automobile Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired vehicles. Further, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Aircraft General Liability and Aircraft Operator's Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired aircraft. In addition, included

Subject to all the terms and conditions of this letter agreement, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (the "Port Authority") hereby grants permission to the permittee set forth below (the "Permittee") to use the space designated below (the "Space") for the purpose described below and for no other purpose whatsoever:

Permittee: Vice Media, Inc., a(n) New York corporation

Facility: Brooklyn-Port Authority Marine Terminal

Space: Pier 9A at Red Hook Container Terminal, or such area, or areas, of the Facility as shall be designated from time to time by the Facility Manager, or his or her authorized designee.

1. This permission is subject to the condition that all filming, videotaping or photography operations of the Permittee shall be conducted only at such times and under such conditions as may be approved by the Facility Manager to insure that the same can be conducted without interfering with other activities and operations at the Facility. The Permittee hereby agrees not to use or have any equipment or permit any condition to exist or to conduct the Permittee's operations or activities so as to interfere with or compromise the safe and efficient operation of the Facility. The Permittee shall contact the above named Facility staff member at the telephone number listed above prior to the Effective Date hereof to coordinate all details of the proposed use of the Space.

4. (a) The Permittee hereby agrees to pay to the Port Authority the greater of (i) the sum of (x) one hundred forty percent (140%) of all Port Authority costs and expenses resulting from or incurred in connection with its operations or activities hereunder including, but not limited to, wages and materials (the "Port Authority Costs") and (y) the daily facility use charge, if any, for filming, videotaping or photography as such charge is determined by the Facility Manager (the "Facility Use Charge") and (ii) the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above.

(b) Upon the Permittee's execution and delivery of this agreement, the Permittee shall pay to the Port Authority the Minimum Administrative Charge set forth above. At the conclusion of the Permittee's operations hereunder, the Port Authority will determine all of the Port Authority Costs in connection with the Permittee's operations and activities hereunder. If the sum of the Port Authority Costs and the Facility Use Charge, if any, is in excess of the said Minimum Administrative Charge, then the Permittee shall pay such excess to the Port Authority upon demand. 6. (a) The Permittee in its name as insured shall secure and pay the premium on a policy of Commercial General Liability Insurance including, but not limited to Premises-Operations and Products-Completed Operations with a Contractual Liability Endorsement for such coverage as shall be stipulated by the Port Authority covering the Permittee's operations hereunder which insurance shall be in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, for each occurrence bodily injury and property damage. In addition, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Automobile Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired vehicles. Further, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Aircraft General Liability and Aircraft Operator's Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired aircraft. 

Insurance Procured by the Contractor

The Contractor shall take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Commercial General Liability Insurance, including but not limited to premises-operations, products-completed operations, liquor liability, set up and take down coverage and independent contractors coverage, with contractual liability language covering the obligations assumed by the Contractor under this Contract and, if vehicles are to be used to carry out the performance of this Contract, then the Contractor shall also take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Automobile Liability Insurance covering owned, non-owned, and hired autos in the following minimum limits:

Commercial General Liability Insurance - \$ 10 million combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.

Automobile Liability Insurance - \$ 5 million combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability.

In addition, the liability policy (ies) shall name "The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey and its related entities, their commissioners, directors, officers, partners, employees and event volunteers" as additional insureds, including but not limited to premise-operations, products-completed operations on the Commercial General Liability Policy. Moreover, the Commercial General Liability Policy shall not contain any provisions for exclusions from liability other than provisions for exclusion from liability forming part of the most up to date ISO form or its equivalent unendorsed Commercial General Liability Policy. The liability policy (ies) and certificate of insurance shall contain separation of insured condition and severability of interests clause for all policies so that coverage will respond as if separate policies were in force for each insured. An act or omission of one of the insureds shall not reduce or void coverage to the other insureds. Any and all excess and umbrella policies shall 'follow form' by conforming to the underlying policies. Furthermore, the Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects to the above additional insureds. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the above additional insureds shall not contribute to any loss or claim. These insurance requirements shall be in effect for the duration of the contract to include any maintenance/warranty/guarantee period.

The Contractor shall also take out, maintain, and pay premiums on Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the requirements of law in the state(s) where work will take place, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1 million each accident. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided in favor of the additional insureds.

Each policy above shall contain an endorsement that the policy may not be canceled, terminated, or modified without thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the Port Authority of NY and NJ, Att: Facility Contract Administrator, at the location where the work will take place and to the General Manager, Risk Management.

The Port Authority may at any time during the term of this agreement change or modify the limits and coverages of insurance. Should the modification or change results in an additional premium, The General Manager, Risk Management for the Port Authority may consider such cost as an out-of-pocket expense.

Within five (5) days after the award of this agreement or contract and prior to the start of work, the Contractor must submit an original certificate of insurance, to the Port Authority of NY and NJ, Facility Contract Administrator, at the location where the work will take place. This certificate of insurance MUST show evidence of the above insurance policy (ies), including but not limited to the cancellation notice endorsement and stating the agreement/contract number prior to the start of work. The General Manager, Risk Management must approve the certificate(s) of insurance before any work can begin. Upon request by the Port Authority, the Contractor shall furnish to the General Manager, Risk Management, a certified copy of each policy, including the premiums.

If at any time the above liability insurance should be canceled, terminated, or modified so that the insurance is not in effect as above required, then, if the Manager shall so direct, the Contractor shall suspend performance of the contract at the premises. If the contract is so suspended, no extension of time shall be due on account thereof. If the contract is not suspended (whether or not because of omission of the Manager to order suspension), then the Authority may, at its option, obtain insurance affording coverage equal to the above required, the cost of such insurance to be payable by the Contractor to the Port Authority.

Renewal certificates of insurance or policies shall be delivered to the Facility Contractor Administrator, Port Authority at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration date of each expiring policy. The General Manager, Risk Management must approve the renewal certificate(s) of insurance before work can resume on the facility. If at any time any of the certificates or policies shall become unsatisfactory to the Port Authority, the Contractor shall promptly obtain a new and satisfactory certificate and policy.

(a) The Permittee acknowledges that the Port Authority shall have no obligation to keep the Space, or any portion thereof, guarded, attended or patrolled and the Permittee further acknowledges that the Port Authority will have no liability of any kind whatsoever for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee or for which the Permittee is responsible placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. Without limiting the foregoing, the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees of and from any and all claims and demands including claims and demands of third persons for loss, theft or damage of or to any property, equipment or materials of the Permittee, or for which the Permittee is responsible, placed or installed on or in the Space or elsewhere at the Facility. In addition to the foregoing, the Permittee shall be the insurer of the Port Authority against the risk of loss or damage arising out of the Permittee's operations to any Port Authority fixtures, equipment and personal property which are a part of or are located in or on the Space and shall promptly replace or repair the same within five (5) days of such loss or damage. Further, the Permittee shall repair, replace or rebuild all or any part of the Space or the Facility which may be damaged or destroyed by the acts or omissions of the Permittee or those of its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Facility. The Port Authority shall have no duty of repair or maintenance as to the Space or any fixtures, equipment or personal property which is located in or on the Space and the Permittee shall accept the same in their "as is" condition.

(b) The Permittee hereby assumes all risks involved in the use of the Space and the Facility under this agreement and the Permittee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents and employees from any and all claims and demands of third parties including, but not limited to, those for personal injuries (including death) and for property damages arising out of or resulting from the Permittee's operations at the Space and the Facility under this agreement or arising out of or resulting from any acts or omissions hereunder on the part of the Permittee, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees or those doing business with it at the Space and the Facility.

6. (a) The Permittee in its name as insured shall secure and pay the premium on a policy of Commercial General Liability Insurance including, but not limited to Premises-Operations and Products-Completed Operations with a Contractual Liability Endorsement for such coverage as shall be stipulated by the Port Authority covering the Permittee's operations hereunder which insurance shall be in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, for each occurrence bodily injury and property damage. In addition, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Automobile Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired vehicles. Further, included in the abovementioned policy shall be Aircraft General Liability and Aircraft Operator's Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired aircraft. In addition, included in the above policy shall be Helicopter Liability Insurance in the minimum limit as set forth on the first page of this agreement, combined single limit per accident for bodily

injury or property damage liability including, but not limited to, owned, non-owned and hired helicopters including passenger helicopters. In addition to the insurance required by this paragraph, the Permittee shall maintain in effect during the entire period hereunder Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance coverage providing full benefits as required by law. The Port Authority shall be named as an additional insured in each such policy required by this agreement, except for Worker's Compensation Insurance and Employer's Liability Insurance, unless the Port Authority directs otherwise, and shall contain a provision that the policies may not be cancelled, terminated or modified without thirty (30) days' written notice to the Port Authority.

(b) As to any insurance required hereunder, a certified copy of each of the policies or a certificate or certificates evidencing the existence thereof, and all required endorsements, or binders, together with a certificate of Workers' Compensation Insurance, shall be delivered to the Port Authority, Risk Financing Division, 225 Park Avenue South, 12th Floor, New York, New York 10003, Attn: Certificate Review, at least five (5) days prior to the Effective Date hereof. Each policy of insurance required hereunder shall contain a provision that the insurer shall not, without obtaining the express advance permission from the General Counsel of the Port Authority, raise any defense involving in any way the jurisdiction of the tribunal over the person of the Port Authority, the immunity of the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents or employees, the governmental nature of the Port Authority or the provisions of any statutes respecting suits against the Port Authority.

(c) The policies referred to in this paragraph shall contain an ISO standard "separation of insureds" clause or a cross liability endorsement providing that the protections afforded to the Permittee thereunder with respect to any claim or action against the Permittee by a third person shall pertain and apply with like effect with respect to any claim or action against the Permittee by the Port Authority and against the Port Authority by the Permittee, but such endorsement shall not limit, vary, change or affect the protections afforded the Port Authority thereunder as an additional insured.

(d) The policies referred to in this paragraph must be specifically endorsed to provide that the policy may not be canceled, terminated, or modified without thirty (30) days' written notice to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, General Manager, Risk Financing, at the address above.

7. Prior to the Effective Date hereof, the Permittee shall promptly supply, in detail, information regarding the nature of the activities contemplated to be performed hereunder and such other information regarding the Permittee's operations and activities hereunder as the Port Authority may reasonably request including, but not limited to, information regarding equipment and other property to be used by the Permittee in its operations or activities at the Facility. The Permittee agrees not to use any equipment or property to which the Port Authority may object and shall change the location of such property or equipment to another location if so directed by the Port Authority. Under no circumstances will the Permittee be permitted to use any hazardous equipment or materials including, but not limited to, firearms and explosives. Failure on the part of the Port Authority to object to the Permittee's operations or activities or to the use of any equipment or property or its location shall not be deemed

to be an approval thereof and the Permittee acknowledges that the Port Authority undertakes no duties or responsibilities of any kind in connection with information supplied by the Permittee and shall have no liability in connection therewith. Under the terms and provisions of this agreement, the Permittee shall not and shall not be permitted to engage in any operations or activities at any area at the Facility unless such operations or activities have been authorized by the Port Authority. The Permittee hereby acknowledges and agrees that all of its operations and activities at the Space and at the Facility shall be conducted at the highest degree of safety and care and be in strict conformity with procedures as may be established by the Port Authority.

8. Without the express written permission of the Port Authority, the Permittee shall not film, videotape or photograph or permit to be filmed, videotaped or photographed any scene or sequence identifying the Facility or any other Port Authority facility (or depicting any aspect thereof). The Permittee shall not use or permit the use in any scene of any vehicles, uniforms, signs or posters or dialogue, which in any way bear or carry the name of the Facility or the name of any other Port Authority facility.

9. The Permittee shall observe, comply with and execute the provisions of any and all present and future governmental laws, rules, regulations, requirements, orders and directions which may pertain or apply to the operations or activities of the Permittee hereunder. The Permittee shall observe and obey (and to compel its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees and those doing business with it to observe and obey) the Rules and Regulations of the Port Authority (a copy of which is available from the Facility Manager) for the government of the Permittee's conduct and operations and activities at the Facility. The operations and activities of the Permittee and those of its officers, employees, agents, contractors, guests, invitees and those doing business with it shall be conducted in an orderly and proper manner so as not to annoy, disturb or be offensive to others at the Facility or interfere with the operations of the Facility and shall be in compliance with all procedures and directives established by the Manager of the Facility or his or her authorized designee. Further, the Permittee shall comply with any directives of the Facility Manager or his or her authorized designee.

10. All property, materials and equipment placed or installed in the Space by the Permittee pursuant to this agreement shall be removed therefrom immediately upon the expiration or earlier termination of this agreement.


11. This agreement may be terminated by the Port Authority without cause upon two (2) days' notice, however the Port Authority may immediately terminate this agreement if the Permittee shall fail to observe or is not in compliance with any of the terms and conditions of this agreement. Termination shall not relieve the Permittee of any obligations, which have accrued on or prior to termination.

12. No Commissioner, officer, agent or employee of the Port Authority shall be charged personally by the Permittee with any liability, or held liable to it, under any term or provision of this Permit, or because of its execution or attempted execution, or because of any breach hereof.

13. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties on the subject matter and may be amended only in writing signed by the parties.

This agreement is forwarded in duplicate. If the terms of the agreement herein contained are satisfactory, the original and duplicate copy of this agreement should be signed by an authorized officer of the Permittee and returned promptly to the Port Authority. The return to the Permittee of a copy of this agreement executed on behalf of the Port Authority will place it into effect.



This Rider is made a part of the letter agreement, ala Permit, dated September 9, 2014, bearing number FLM-004BP (the "Permit") granting Vice Media, Inc. (the "Permittee") permission to conduct filming at Brooklyn-Port Authority Marine Terminal on September 12-13, 2014 by the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey (the "Port Authority") for the purposes described in the Permit. All terms used herein and not defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to such terms in the Permit.

The parties agree to modify the terms of the Permit as follows:

1. Paragraph 14: the following is added as Paragraph 14 of the Permit:

"14. This Permit and any claim, dispute or controversy arising out of, under or related to this Permit, the relationship of the parties hereunder, and/or the interpretation and enforcement of the rights and obligation of the parties hereunder shall be governed by, interpreted and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New York, without regard to choice of law principles. The Permittee and the Port Authority agree that any action at law or equity arising out of this Permit, including to enforce the terms of this Permit or to seek a remedy for breach thereof, shall be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction located in the County of Kings of the State of New York, and the Permittee and the Port Authority agree that neither party will object to any such action being brought in such court on the ground that the court lacks personal jurisdiction, or that venue is improper or inconvenient."





Food Safety & Handling Comments

- Provide the name and address of all food suppliers and the specific food they will be providing.
- Provide a copy of the current New York City Department of Health & Mental Hygiene Permit to Operate a Food Establishment (or the appropriate jurisdiction) from each food supplier.
- Provide a list of all menu items that will be served.
- Provide metal stem type thermometers (or thermocouple type) for employees to verify food temperatures. In addition, provide alcohol swabs for cleaning thermometers in between use. Instruct employees on the proper use of thermometers.
- Verify that all food products, when picked up/received from suppliers, are at the proper temperature – 41 degrees F. for cold products and 140 degrees F. for hot products. Products must be transported in properly insulated containers.
- Provide details on the procedures that will be implemented to ensure that when food is on display or in storage, that employees are ensuring that proper temperatures are maintained – 41 degrees F. for cold and 140 degrees F. for hot. All cold food must be displayed on ice. Ice should be at same level as food. Display type refrigeration units should be utilized if available.
- If using refrigeration units, refrigeration must be set at 33 – 38 degrees F. in order to maintain food at 41 degrees F. and must be operating at those temperatures prior to placing food inside refrigerator.
- When food is placed on display, it should be covered or protected by sneeze guards or equivalent
- Ensure that hot holding units are at the proper temperature prior to displaying food.
- Limit the amount of food on display.
- Provide sanitizing stations by serving area for employees. Employees must be provided with gloves. The gloves should be changed frequently and employees should use the sanitizer when changing gloves.
- Employees should wear hair restraints and clean outer clothing (disposable aprons, etc.).
- If using coolers to store food the coolers must be stored off the ground.



McLaren Engineering Group (MEG) has completed our review of the structural safety of several rigged elements for a private, temporary outdoor event to be installed on an existing gantry crane at Red Hook Terminal in Brooklyn, NY. The event will be held from September 9-12, 2014. The effects consist of a 13' diameter LED Mirror Ball hung from the crane, the DJ Reveal effect assembly, and the Bottle Lighting Truss assembly. MEG has reviewed drawings and rigging plots furnished by Tony Bonilla of BNW Rigging. Facility impact loads imposed on the gantry crane were compared to allowable loads dictated by crane documentation for the existing Bromma AST-6 20/40/45 Twin Twenty Ft. Telescopic Spreader, furnished by BNW Rigging.

It is MEG's professional opinion that the existing gantry crane and proposed rigging will safely support the LED Mirror Ball and DJ Reveal Effect if properly assembled and used in accordance with the guidelines within this letter and the attached Severe Weather Action Plan. HOWEVER, MEG is in the process of evaluating this system with the added Bottle Lighting Truss assembly, which may affect the use guidelines for the Mirror Ball and DJ Reveal. A revised letter will be furnished addressing the combined assembly incorporating the Bottle Lighting Truss assembly.

Modifications to the typical usage of the gantry crane structure shall be limited to suspending elements with small wind areas relative to the crane, which may easily be lowered in the event of high winds. Modifications including cladding of the structure with soft goods, hard projection surfaces, and lighting with significant projected area will induce loading on the crane structure for which it has not been designed and shall not be allowed.

Element Descriptions:

The LED mirror ball, by others, will be suspended from a truss grid rigged to the existing crane spreader beam. The mirror ball will be picked by two 2-ton chain motor hoists with appropriately sized hardware as shown in the drawings and attached to a rigging point on the mirror ball. Once raised into position, the ball will remain static and is tied off to mooring posts on the pier and to the gantry crane. The truss grid will consist of (2) 28" Camco L Box Trusses running 30 ft. stage left to

stage right, spaced 5'-8" apart and picked at the ends from the spreader beam lifting lugs. Each lug point is rated for a maximum load of 12.5 tons as per the provided documentation. At center span above the mirror ball, a 14" Camco M Box Truss will run upstage/downstage. At each end of the 28" Camco L Box Truss will be a 12" Tomcat aluminum plated box truss running 30 ft. upstage to downstage suspending additional lighting. The total weight of the mirror ball, miscellaneous lighting, cables, rigging, and hardware will be 4000 lbs, resulting in 1000 lbs per lifting lug. The most onerous lateral loads induced by wind on the ball will not exceed 600 lbs, the majority of which shall be resolved by two 1/4" lateral guy cables in each direction anchored to existing mooring posts on the pier.

Upstage of the mirror ball truss will be a "DJ Reveal" effect. A 20 ft. shipping container will be lifted by the crane from ground level and raised 30 ft., and will then travel 10 ft. downstage. The shipping container will suspend from the main girders of the gantry crane with (8) chain hoists, plus an additional hoist tied laterally to pull ("breast") the container downstage. Each hoist will be suspended from the crane structure with the use of Lift All EE6D Roundsling ("Spanset") and 5/8" shackle. Additionally a secondary steel safety cable shall be provided at each point. Downstage movement of the container shall be limited to maintain a maximum 18° angle off of vertical in the supporting hoist chains.

The Bottle Lighting Truss will consist of prefabricated rental box truss arranged in the shape of a bottle. The truss will be clad with lights and suspended from the main crane structure with four 2-ton chain motors placed at the ends and third points of the Bottle truss assembly. The structure shall be designed to support its self-weight plus the weight of lighting and loads induced by wind. As the design and loading of the Bottle Lighting Truss effect have not been finalized, this letter serves to introduce the design concept. The final drawings will reflect a safe design in accordance with the 2008 New York City Building Code.

MEG has based its review on the following documentation:

1. "14.9.12 Absolute rig plot v3 8/31.vwx" drawing, furnished by Tony Bonilla of BNW Rigging
2. "10553M~1 copy 2" operation manual for Bromma AST-6 20/40/45 Twin Twenty Ft. Telescopic Spreader, furnished by Tony Bonilla of BNW Rigging
3. Weights as reported by Tony Bonilla of BNW Rigging:
 - a. Mirror ball lighting, and rigging: 4000 lbs
 - b. 20' container outfitted as DJ booth, and rigging: 7700 lbs

Overhead Rigging System:

1. The weight estimates are based on component catalog's information and Rigger's estimates. The Head Rigger is responsible for verifying that all rigged weights do not exceed the original estimates. It is understood that the set will be lifted in a sequence to minimize overall dynamic impact load on the crane. A 25% impact factor was considered to account for chain motor impact.
2. No 1-ton chain motor shall be left with a load greater than 2000 lbs supported from it. No 2-ton chain motor shall be left with a load greater than 4000 lbs supported from it.

3. All trussing, rigging, chain motors and hardware shall be visually inspected by the Head Rigger. Furthermore, these items shall be load rated, and shall be used in accordance with the manufacturer's guidelines. No changes shall be made without the written approval of MEG.
4. The Head Rigger will use rated roundslings, cable slings and/or other rated hardware to connect suspended elements to the crane steel structure. Provide appropriate padding or protection as needed to avoid damaging the crane and rigging.
5. When operating chain hoists, the control operator must have a clear line of sight to the hoist motors in order to allow the motors to be stopped immediately if needed.
6. Anytime a chain hoist is raised or lowered a verbal warning shall be given to alert all personnel in the area that the hoists are being activated.
7. Personnel shall avoid standing or walking directly below mechanized items while they are being moved vertically. When construction-related work must occur in areas below moving equipment, the Head Rigger shall make sure that all present are aware of the moving overhead equipment.
8. People working at height are to use appropriate fall protection equipment. All work shall comply with OSHA and local safety regulations.
9. When operating chain hoists, the Operator shall wait a minimum of 4 seconds between subsequent button presses to allow the system to settle.

Since MEG representatives will not be present during the construction or installation of the rigging system, we cannot certify that it has been correctly installed. Please advise our office in the event there are any changes to the design, equipment list, construction or loading of the structural steel so we may reassess the system. 


PLATE 6: CONTAINER DETAIL PLAN




PLATE 7: GLOBE TRUSS DETAIL




PLATE 8: FRONT ELEVATION BOTTLE W/ CALLOUTS






SITE MAP #3 – Entry Area Queues

The Contractor shall take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Commercial General Liability Insurance, including but not limited to premises-operations, products-completed operations, liquor liability, set up and take down coverage and independent contractors coverage, with contractual liability language covering the obligations assumed by the Contractor under this Contract and, if vehicles are to be used to carry out the performance of this Contract, then the Contractor shall also take out, maintain, and pay the premiums on Automobile Liability Insurance covering owned, non-owned, and hired autos in the following minimum limits:

Commercial General Liability Insurance - \$ 10 million combined single limit per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage liability.

Automobile Liability Insurance - \$ 5 million combined single limit per accident for bodily injury and property damage liability.

In addition, the liability policy (ies) shall name "The Port Authority of New York and New Jersey and its related entities, their commissioners, directors, officers, partners, employees and event volunteers" as additional insureds, including but not limited to premise-operations, products-completed operations on the Commercial General Liability Policy. Moreover, the Commercial General Liability Policy shall not contain any provisions for exclusions from liability other than provisions for exclusion from liability forming part of the most up to date ISO form or its equivalent unendorsed Commercial General Liability Policy. The liability policy (ies) and certificate of insurance shall contain separation of insured condition and severability of interests clause for all policies so that coverage will respond as if separate policies were in force for each insured. An act or omission of one of the insureds shall not reduce or void coverage to the other insureds. Any and all excess and umbrella policies shall 'follow form' by conforming to the underlying policies. Furthermore, the Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects to the above additional insureds. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the above additional insureds shall not contribute to any loss or claim. These insurance requirements shall be in effect for the duration of the contract to include any maintenance/warranty/guarantee period.

The certificate of insurance and liability policy (ies) must contain the following endorsement for the above liability coverages:

"The insurer(s) shall not, without obtaining the express advance written permission from the General Counsel of the Port Authority, raise any defense involving in any way the jurisdiction of the Tribunal over the person of the Port Authority, the immunity of the Port Authority, its Commissioners, officers, agents or employees, the governmental nature of the Port Authority, or the provisions of any statutes respecting suits against the Port Authority."

The Contractor shall also take out, maintain, and pay premiums on Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the requirements of law in the state(s) where work will take place, and Employer's Liability Insurance with limits of not less than \$1 million each accident. A waiver of subrogation shall be provided in favor of the additional insureds.

Each policy above shall contain an endorsement that the policy may not be canceled, terminated, or modified without thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the Port Authority of NY and NJ, Att: Facility Contract Administrator, at the location where the work will take place and to the General Manager, Risk Management.

The Port Authority may at any time during the term of this agreement change or modify the limits and coverages of insurance. Should the modification or change results in an additional premium, The General Manager, Risk Management for the Port Authority may consider such cost as an out-of-pocket expense.

Within five (5) days after the award of this agreement or contract and prior to the start of work, the Contractor must submit an original certificate of insurance, to the Port Authority of NY and NJ, Facility Contract Administrator, at the location where the work will take place. This certificate of insurance MUST show evidence of the above insurance policy (ies), including but not limited to the cancellation notice endorsement and stating the agreement/contract number prior to the start of work. The General Manager, Risk Management must approve the certificate(s) of insurance before any work can begin. Upon request by the Port Authority, the Contractor shall furnish to the General Manager, Risk Management, a certified copy of each policy, including the premiums.

If at any time the above liability insurance should be canceled, terminated, or modified so that the insurance is not in effect as above required, then, if the Manager shall so direct, the Contractor shall suspend performance of the contract at the premises. If the contract is so suspended, no extension of time shall be due on account thereof. If the contract is not suspended (whether or not because of omission of the Manager to order suspension), then the Authority may, at its option, obtain insurance affording coverage equal to the above required, the cost of such insurance to be payable by the Contractor to the Port Authority.

Renewal certificates of insurance or policies shall be delivered to the Facility Contractor Administrator, Port Authority at least fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration date of each expiring policy. The General Manager, Risk Management must approve the renewal certificate(s) of insurance before work can resume on the facility. If at any time any of the certificates or policies shall become unsatisfactory to the Port Authority, the Contractor shall promptly obtain a new and satisfactory certificate and policy.

The requirements for insurance procured by the Contractor shall not in any way be construed as a limitation on the nature or extent of the contractual obligations assumed by the Contractor under this contract. The insurance requirements are not a representation by the Authority as to the adequacy of the insurance to protect the Contractor against the obligations imposed on them by law or by this or any other Contract.
