## *Port Authority Toll Facilities*

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### Facilities

- 4 bridges: George Washington, Goethals, Bayonne, and Outerbridge Crossing
- 2 tunnels: Lincoln and Holland
- 8 toll plazas
- 72 toll lanes

Annual Traffic Volumes: 243 million vehicles

Annual Toll Revenue: \$967 million

# *PA Toll Collection System, Now and Tomorrow*

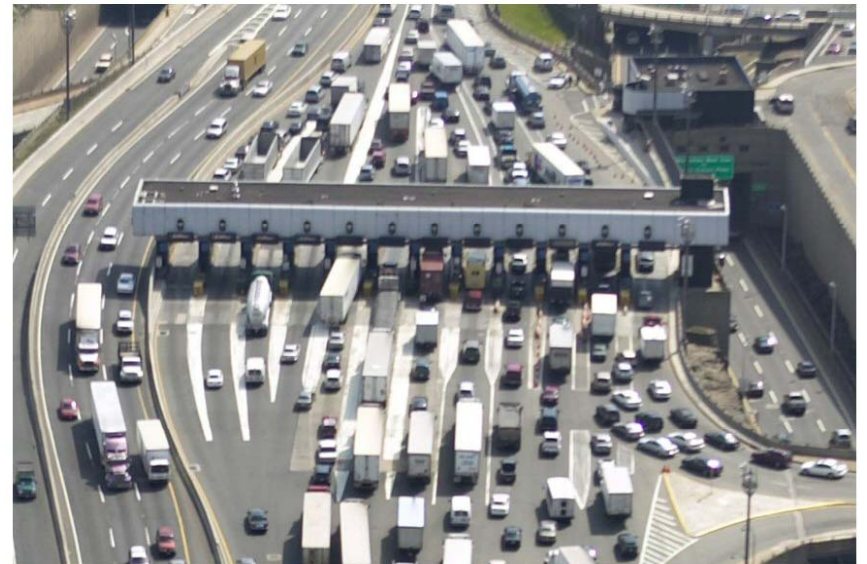
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Collects Nearly \$1 Billion in Revenues Each Year
