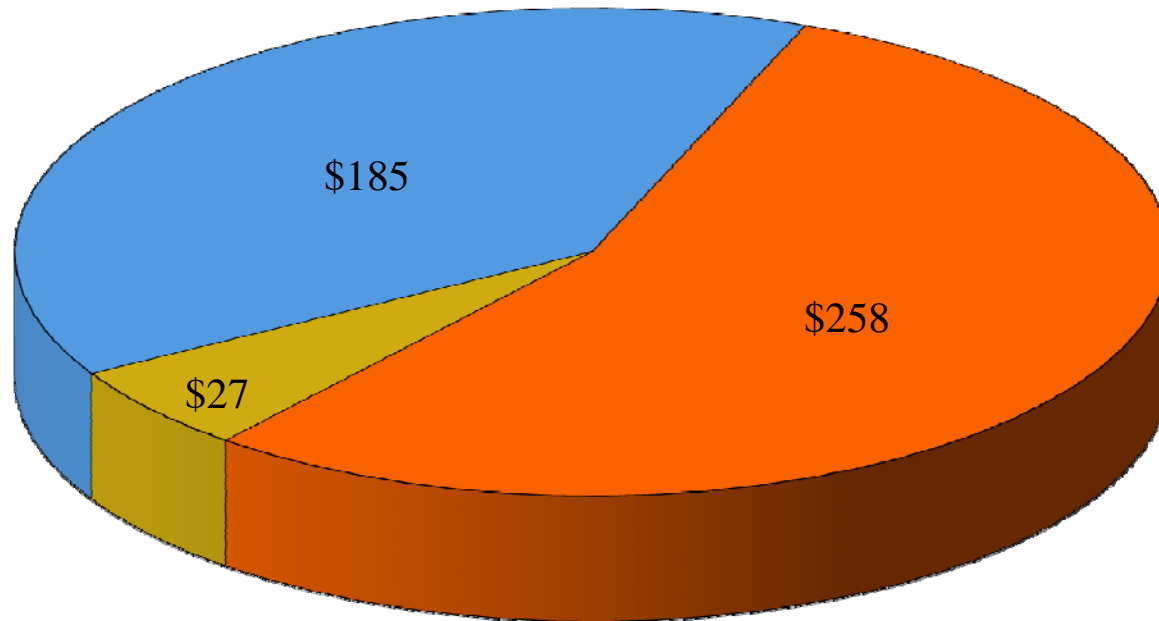

2010 M/WBE PERFORMANCE COMPARED WITH AGENCY GOAL AND THREE-YEAR AVERAGE

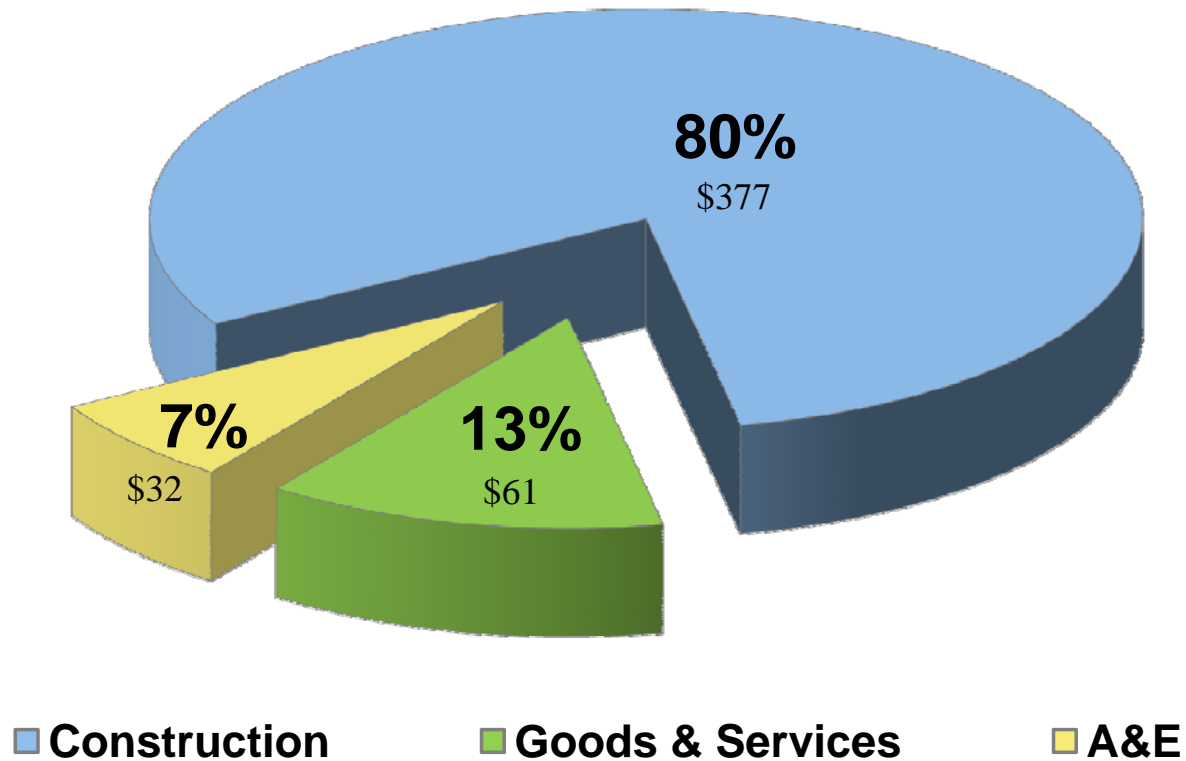
- The 2010 total of \$470 million represents 22 percent of all contract awards, which is above the annual agency goal of 17 percent for M/WBE participation.
- These results compare favorably with the prior three year average of \$424 million, which represents almost 16 percent in MWBE participation.

REGIONAL ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF TOTAL AWARDS

The regional economic impact estimates of the total \$470 million in contract awards to M/W/SBEs:

- Supported nearly 3,500 jobs in the region
- Generated more than \$188 million in wages
- Produced approximately \$601 million in regional economic activity

REGIONAL ECONOMIC IMPACTS OF CONSTRUCTION AWARDS

The regional economic impact estimates of the total \$377 million in construction contract awards to M/W/SBEs:

- Supported 2,360 jobs in the region
- Generated approximately \$143 million in wages
- Produced \$485 million in regional economic activity

CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

- 16 M/WBEs participated in the Mentor-Protégé Program in 2010
- 37 M/WBEs have participated in the program since its inception in 2002
- A pilot initiative designed for firms grossing under \$500K annually was implemented with eight participant firms
- Seven protégés successfully bid on eight Port Authority contracts totaling approximately \$4.7 million



CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMS

- Renewed contract with Regional Alliance for Small Contractors
- Offered over 20 construction management, technical and business software courses
- Construction Management and the 10-hour OSHA certificate programs remain popular for construction firms
